"CHICKORY" — COFFEE SUBSTITUTE

Chickory is sometimes called Blue Sailor or Coffee-Weed and is a problem in old pastures, fence rows and waste places.

In some European countries, the plant is actually grown for its roots, which are dried, ground and roasted as a coffee substitute. I have also heard of Italian families cultivating chickory for salad making.

However, whether you may like it's flavor in coffee or salads, we do not advocate planting as it is listed as a noxious weed under the Weed Act and can be very troublesome to farmers.

Chlorum intybus (chickory) introduced from Europe, is a very showy biennial or short-lived perennial with a bright blue flower which is only open for a short period of time daily. It has a very deep, penetrating taproot system and a tall, four-foot branching, rather ragged looking stem, arising from a group of dandelion shaped leaves which are spread close to the ground.

Like other noxious weeds, the chickory should be controlled when the first few plants appear. This can easily be accomplished by cutting well below the crown with a spade or shovel.

If the infestation is extensive, plow it deep in late autumn and use the land for cultivated crops for two years before seeding to grass. Close grazing by sheep will control the weed in pastures.

Spraying with 12 oz. acid per acre with 2.4-D in late spring will control chickory in pastures. In new seedling and bare stands of clover and alfalfa, use 2924 ounces of 2,4-D acid in 20 gallons of water per acre.

Carelessness cause of most brush fires

Forest and brush fires destroyed more than \$136,000,000 of Canada's national resources during the past 10 years. Across the country, 6,000 fires of this type can be expected each year, according to the All Canada Insurance Federation.

Human carelessness causes most forest and brush fires. The Federation, which represents most Canadian fire, automobile and casualty insurance companies, asks each Canadian to take these precautions to help prevent forest fires.

Precautions: (1) Never throw cigarettes or matches from car windows — 15 per cent of forest fires are caused by careless smokers. (2) Build campfires on rock or bare earth. Be sure your fire is well away from dry timber. (3) Drown campfires or smother them with earth before you leave the campsite. (4) Break matches in half before discarding. This precaution insures that the flame is extinguished. (5) When hiking, stamp cigarettes out on rocks or bare earth. If possible, douse them with water. (6) If you live in the vicinity of a bush or forest, equip all chimneys on your home or cabin with spark screens. (7) Broken bottles should be buried. The sun's rays when magnified by glass can start fires. (8) If you spot a forest fire, however small, report it to police or forest officials immediately.
