COUNTY OF HALTON WEED CONTROL NEWS

Purslane or Wild Purslane is one of the worst weeds, persisting in flower beds and gardens. It has great ability to stay alive, even after being cut or pulled. Due to its ability to store up food in its branches, it will often take root after being dried on several days in the sun.

Wild Purslane is a real squawk plant and curiously is recognized by its fleshy red stems and thick wedge shaped leaves. The flowers are bright yellow, about one-quarter inch across, and are open only for a few hours in the morning.

It is often a problem in beds of shrubbery, nursery stock and garden crops such as onions, which do not provide dense shade. Early cultivation has little effect on Purslane as the seeds do not germinate until the soil is well warmed up in early summer. Plants that are hoed out should be destroyed because they will still form seeds after they are pulled from the ground.

Control with weed chemicals is limited due to the variety of garden and nursery crops usually present where Purslane appears. The chemical companies and agricultural colleges are working every year to bring to light a chemical or combination of chemicals that will be selective so far as common horticultural crops are concerned. At the present time, however, there are no overall recommendations in this regard.

A product called Chloral (PC) can be used effectively for the control of Purslane in crops of onions, carrots and potatoes. It also is used in a granular form in established beds of woody nursery stocks. CIPC should not be used on tree fruit nursery stock and some other varieties may be injured by this chemical.

22 Halton nurses threaten to quit

Twenty-two of the 26 public health nurses employed by Halton County Health Unit have written and mailed letters of resignation and they will carry out their threat on Monday, September 12 if the Halton Board of Health does not begin contract negotiations by that date.

The ultimatum was issued Thursday as the final chapter in what the nurses hope will end their year-long dispute with the Board of Health. Backed by the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario, they joined the staffs of the Stouffville, Glengarry and Dundas Counties Health Unit in writing letters of resignation.

Miss Doris Gibney, an official of R.N.A.O., said the double set of resignation threats constituted a "graylisting" of the two Health Units. "The nurses have no intention of walking out," Miss Gibney added. "They have written proper letters of resignation and given one month's notice."

The labor problem began in July of 1965 when the nurses, dissatisfied with wages and working conditions at the Health Unit's offices scattered through Halton, organized a chapter of R.N.A.O. at Oakville and applied to the Labor Relations Board of Ontario for a hearing.

The night before the L.R.B.O. hearing Halton County Board of Health passed a resolution under Section 89 of the Labor Relations Act, excluding itself from the necessity of bargaining with the nurses.

While the nurses protested, the Board's act was legal. On June 3rd of this year the staff forwarded a letter asking permission to negotiate a contract. A second letter June 28 and a third on July 12 (which threatened a mass resignation) brought no answers and no action, as the Board continued to refuse recognition of the Association as a bargaining unit.

Finally, on Thursday, the 22 nurses mailed in their letters of resignation. Unless negotiations for a contract begin before Monday, September 12, they do not plan to show up for work. Miss Gibney said the R.N.A.O. was giving "full support" to the Halton nurses and is asking other nurses not to accept positions in the two Health Units involved.

School bus rules are being revised

When a motor vehicle meets a school bus on a highway where the speed limit is greater than 35 miles per hour, the vehicle must stop before reaching the bus if the two red signal lights on the bus are illuminated, according to recent amendments to the highway traffic act.

In last week's issue of this paper, a story incorrectly stated, motorists's must stop before reaching the school bus and proceed only when the signal lights are operating. It should have read "not operating".
