Change in council pay studied Tuesday night

figures for councillors this year to date, leaving out names of councillors. The maximum attendance noted for one meeting was 19 attended and four missed. He stated with 16 scheduled meetings for the balance of the year, there wasn't any possibility of reaching 60 meetings this year.

A recommendation from No. 1 committee to adopt a lettering by-law similar to the one in effect in Georgetown, raised councillor C. P. Leadbald's curiosity as to existing by-laws to this effect. He was of the opinion that the town of Acton presently had a lettering by-law and suggested it be investigated and properly administered.

He said at present there is a change of lettering under consideration and was of the opinion if the Crown Attorney agreed the information warrant, it would be upheld in court ahead of a signature by the Justice of the Peace.

Reeve H. H. Hinton said he didn't feel the Georgetown by-law has been properly tested as the only conviction to date is being appealed.

Councillor Drinkwater reported a ratepayer had been plagued with vandalism at his business place, having had an awning slit, ripped and even torn down.

It was agreed to have No. 1 committee review existing by-laws regarding lettering before action is taken.

The problem of dead trees in the cemetery was again Tuesday when Mrs. Doris Fyfe reported John Pol of Caroline Nurseries had investigated and found three of the trees had never grown, but the balance had been left and then appeared to have died. Mr. Pol suggested council wait until spring when it would be possible to determine how many trees had actually died. He also suggested the trees had died because they had not been watered properly. It was agreed to have Mr. Pol attend the next committee meeting to discuss the problem. The trees are under quarantine.

By request of the P.M. Board, council agreed to allow a person to park on King and Park Aves. for the Tuesday, Friday and Saturday, 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturdays. This is a new application from P.M. Board and Councilor Leadbald.

The motion was approved to attend the Central Ontario Regional Development Council seminar at Toronto, September 12. The mayor had asked that the Finance chairman and clerk administration also be authorized to attend and the regular meeting of council postponed that night, but this was not approved. Councilor Leadbald objected to deferring council as he had arranged his business to enable him to attend Tuesday. Reeve Hinton objected to other than the mayor attending.

A debenture by-law for financing the library will be drafted as soon as the clerk administrator leaves of the interest rate from lending houses.

During enquiries by members, Councilor Massey expressed his concern regarding the increase in motorbike accidents and asked council's consideration in sponsoring a resolution for support of other municipalities, seeking more stringent government control. The mayor informed him this had already been processed at the Mayors' and Reeves' convention.

Attending the meeting were Mayor Les Duby, Reeve H. H. Hinton and councillors Mrs. Doris Fyfe, D. E. G. Oakes, Robert Drinkwater, Charles Leadbald, Earl Massey and William Williams. Deputy Reeve K. R. Parker was absent.
