Speedy Seaforth Beavers inflict 5-2 loss on Tanners

Displaying the zip which took them to the O.H.A. Int. B championship for two years running, Seaforth Beavers downed Acton Tanners 5-2 here Friday night in front of 300 frost-bitten fans.

Beavers gave the Acton club a lesson in hockey for two periods before the Tanners seemed to catch on to their hurtling, hustling, checkboard style of play. In the final stanza, the Acton club slowed them down with some hard body thumps.

It was the only chapter they matched goals with the visitors who arrived a half hour late for the contest due to icy roads.

In spite of a stellar performance by Jim Sweeney in the Acton nets, Seaforth had a 2-0 edge at the end of the first period. They kept the Tanners off balance with postiferous forechecking hampering any kind of an original attack.

They added two more goals in the second period while Acton got back in the game with their first.

Behind 4-1 as they went into the third period, the Tanners pulled up their socks, bugging another goal to get very much back in contention. Sub-goalie Jim Collins, who replaced regular netminder Chuck Petrie at the end of the first period, shut the door on them from that point on, however. Veteran Ken Dolg potted a goal at the 15:43 mark to put the game on ice.

Much of the credit must go to the Beaver defense who erected a tight defensive umbrella around Collins. The Tanners helped by displaying some erratic shots which couldn't quite hit the target.

Beavers' accent is on youth with a sprinkling of veterans

headed by former American league sharpshooter Ken Dolg. They can skate hard all night without visibly tiring.

Coch Fred Kenner again only had two lines to throw out against the speedy Beavers. Three players who could really help against a club with Seaforth's speed - Tim Haines, Dan Arbc and Beaver Baxter - were not in uniform. Haines suffered a whiplash injury in a car accident and he's likely to be lost to the team for weeks.

Jim Dick scored both Bea-

ver markers in the first period of Friday's game, his second while Richardson served an elbowing penalty. With Seaforth short in the early minutes of the second stanza, Jim Cunningham's shot from the point found the mark for Acton's first goal. Sweeney made a sparkling stop of Dolg's breakaway on the previous play to save the Tanners' bacon.

McIlwain added another for the visitors at 7:44 when he and Dolg broke loose and Butenmiller made it 4-1 at 9:53 when he stole the puck from Blake Inglis and pocketed it behind Sweeney. Both clubs were short.

The Tanners played ragged hockey in the early minutes of the third period before Doug (Smoky) Richardson's backhand beat Collins from a play around the Beaver net at 5:10 while the visitors sat out a penalty. The goal seemed to give the Acton club new heart and with a bit of luck, they could have made it much more interesting. Dolg's final tally at 15:43 sewed it up for Beavers.

They lost goalie Petrie in the first period when he toppled over backwards and sustained a long gash on his head which required stitches. St. John Ambulance officer Bob Hart treated him at the scene and assisted him to the doctor's office. Collins replaced the 45-year-old Petrie in the nets.
