Cow bought on holiday trip named All-Time Class Leader

An Easter holiday self-education trip a 14-year-old Hornby area schoolboy took five years ago, is beginning to pay big dividends.

Lorne Ellis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Ella of Rock-Ella Jersey Farm at Hornby, was pretty happy last week when his Jersey cow Brownlane Kavola's Jossy was named an All-Time Class Leader for milk production in the mature class of the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club competitions.

It was in April of 1961 that Lorne, then a year-old 4-H club member with an avid interest in farming, decided to take an Easter holiday trip to Eastern Canada with a friend, Bill Alexander of Norval. The two flew to New Brunswick and spent their holiday touring some of the better farms, and before he returned home Lorne had purchased Jossy from the farm of Sterling Brown and Sons, Harvey Station, N.B.

Jossy, now a five-year-old, has been classified "Very Good". She produced at five years of age in 305 days (2x) 19,263 lbs. milk and 864 lbs. fat, 4.49 per cent, B.C.A. 258-214, to win a Gold Medal and Medal of Merit. In doing so, she replaced the former leader in this class, Sparkle Supurb Nanella, owned by Jean-Paul Dubuc, a cow that established the former record in 1965.

Jossy now holds two All-Time Canadian records. Last year, she established the present Junior 4-year-old 305 (2x) milk record at 4-66-305-17,592-763 - 4.34 per cent, Silver Medal, Gold Medal and Medal of Merit. In 1964, she won an Ontario

Class Leader as a junior three-year-old.

Last year as a four-year-old Jossy won the Master Foods plaque and a Certificate of Recognition as high cow in the Halton Jersey Club for the Year.

Prise work of Dr. A. Bull

The "outstanding work and tireless efforts" of Dr. Archie F. Bull, Halton County's Medical Officer of Health since July 1952 were recognized on Tuesday when Halton County Council accepted with "regret" his resignation.

Reeve Herbert Merry of Oakville stated, "on behalf of the members of council which accept with regret his resignation, I suggest we send a letter to him and that it be signed by every member of council personally."

Reeve Merry continued, "I don't think at times we've recognized his efforts as much as we should. What is a loss to the people of Halton is a great gain to somebody else."

Deputy-Reeve R. R. Parker, chairman of the County Board of Health for 1966 suggested, "he's been very helpful to the members of the board and has always fulfilled our requests with dispatch as well as with a smile, which isn't always the case in business today."

Deputy-Reeve Parker reported the appointment of a new medical officer of health for the County is entirely the responsibility of the Board of Health, and after the selection is made, it will be forwarded to the Minister of Health for approval. The Minister of Health has a marked scarcity of competent men in Ontario to fill the job, he said.

Notices of the vacancy will be soon published and the Deputy-Reeve said, "this is a directorial position and I would think it would be completely wrong at this stage to even suggest a salary." He indicated it might be one, two or three months before applications are received, since the qualifications for such a position are very rigid.

Warden H. H. Hinton, Reeve of Acton suggested, "there is a distinct possibility this position could be filled by an administrator and a Medical Officer of Health."

A motion directing the Board of Health to take the necessary action toward hiring to fill the vacancy was approved. Only Deputy-Reeve Parker voted against it — "because it is redundant."
