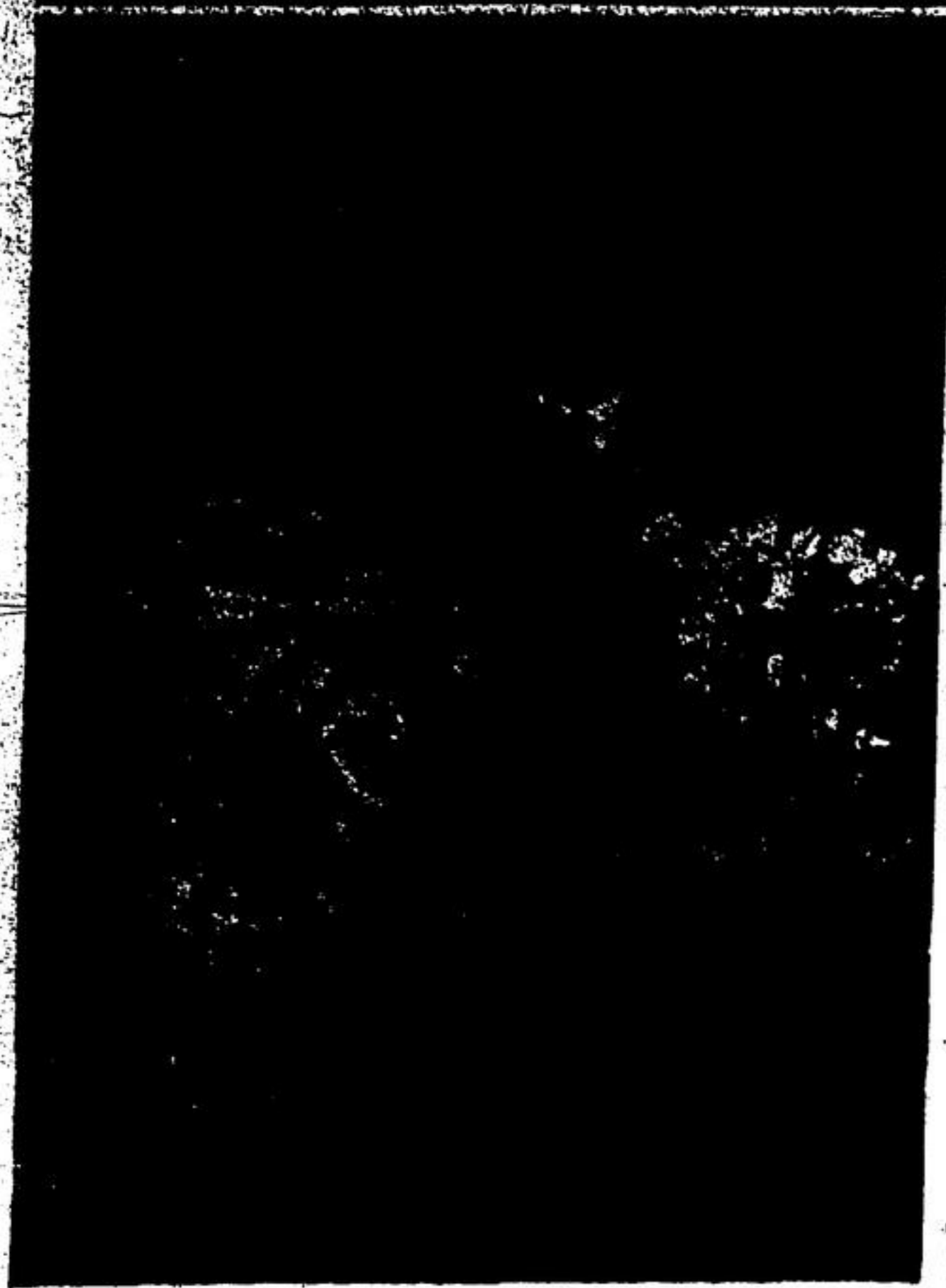
A dance followed in Brookville Hall.
