Funeral services Wednesday for veteran Thomas Bennett
 After nine days in Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto, Thomas E. Bennett, 79 Lake Ave., passed away on January 16. Funeral services were held at the Rumley-Shoemaker Funeral Home on Wednesday afternoon, January 18, conducted by the Rev. A. H. McKenzie. Interment followed at Fairview Cemetery.
 Pallbearers were Harold Smith, Ivan Harris, Rudolph Spielvogel, Sam Brunelle, Clark Armstrong and Joseph Petric.
 A Canadian Legion service was held Tuesday evening. Mr. Bennett was born March 30, 1883 in Erin Township, son of Robert and Mary Bennett. A veteran of World War I, he went overseas in 1915 after enlisting at Toronto and training at Niagara. He served with the 20th Battalion. He was wounded at Amiens just before the war ended, and was in hospital in England for months before returning home in 1919. There was a celebration in town the day he returned with a school holiday. He received the Military Medal for bravery in the field.
 He was a barber in the Lansdowne Ave. area in Toronto, and in later years, when he made his home in Acton with his sister, Miss M. Z. Bennett, Lake Ave., he assisted Acton barbers when required. He is also survived by another sister, Mrs. Elmer Terry (Margaret), Brantford.
 He was a member of the Acton Branch of the Canadian Legion, the 20th Battalion club and the 1st Central Ontario Regiment, Scarborough. While barbering in Acton he was held in high esteem by his many patrons and as a member of the Legion was popular with all members. He made daily visits from his home uptown to pick up the mail and shop, and always had a friendly word for everyone he met.
