Mr. Hansen told the board registration forms for next year's grade nine students are being prepared and arrangements to visit parents of these students at feeder schools will be completed this month.

Inspector Tallifer visited the French department at the school and the principal reported she was quite pleased.

Feeling figures of the past term at the school, teacher-management committee head Ray Arbie asked vice-principal Joe Bray if some other method of compiling the report of the past term couldn't be used.

"What conclusion can you draw from these figures?" he asked. "I can't evaluate them as they are. I need an analysis of them. They should relate to teacher and class."

Until we can correlate a pupil's mark with his intelligence, said Mr. Bray, it would be very hard to do.

Principal Hansen agreed some sort of more meaningful interpretation was needed. "I can't draw any conclusions from these figures," said the committee chairman.

The board agreed \$25 would be a proper figure to charge for use of the school auditorium for one night and a \$40 rental fee would also include a rehearsal.

Trustees McPhail and Moffat thought the charge could be more reasonable, with Mr. Moffat contending a dance recital being planned for the auditorium was educational for those who performed.

Property chairmen McPhail reported repairs to the building had been completed. He also relayed a request from caretakers that if a new tractor was purchased for cutting grass, it include a snow blower.

"The town clears away snow at the school," stated trustee Anderson, "why do you want a snow blower?"

There is a lot of shovelling at entranceways and the caretakers aren't getting any younger, explained Mr. Bray.

The present tractor, used for cutting grass, is 12 years old, explained Mr. McPhail. He told the board he would look into the situation.

O.P.P. report 10 accidents in past week

During the period Jan. 29 to Feb. 4, personnel of the Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, worked a total of 897½ hours and patrolled a total of 8,717 miles on area highways.
