Record high in net sales for A.P. Green

Consolidated net sales of A. P. Green Refractories Co. for the first quarter ended March 31, 1967, were \$17,423,124 — a record high for first quarter sales — as compared with \$15,798,460 for the same quarter a year ago. William S. Lowe, president, told stockholders at the company's annual meeting at Mexico, Missouri. Net earnings, however, were \$760,593, or 48 cents per common share, as compared to \$906,307, or 58 cents per share, for the first quarter in 1966.

"While the year began with a record backlog," Mr. Lowe said, "there was a considerable increase in shipments from the previous two quarters. First quarter results were also affected by higher operating costs due to increases in wages and costs of materials and supplies. Severe weather conditions caused an extra expense and some delay in shipments."

"The majority of our plants are operating at capacity," Mr. Lowe said, "backlog continues high and the demand for refractories is still fairly good in most of the industries we serve, although in certain areas there is a definite softness."

All members of the Board of Directors were re-elected.
