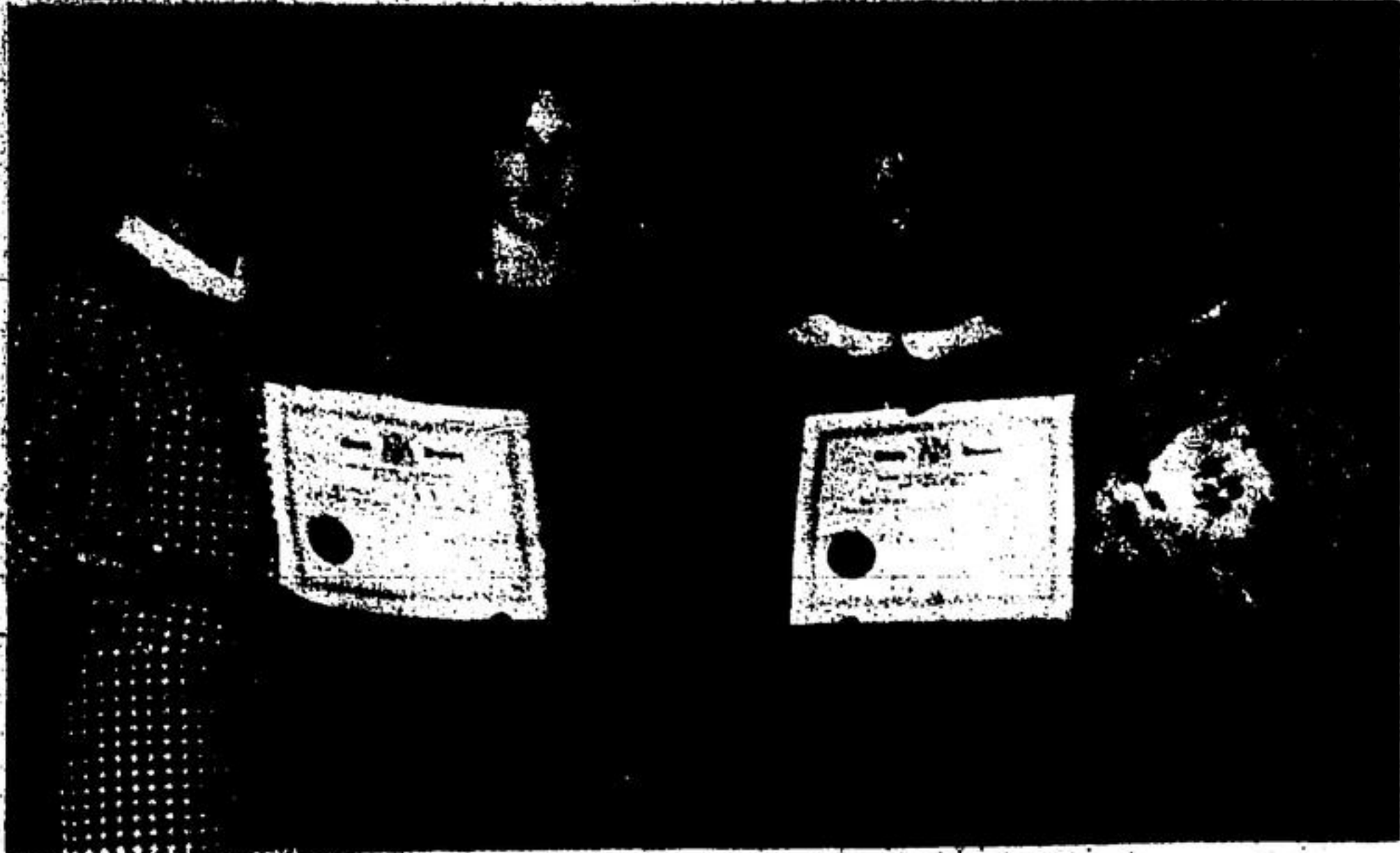

## Acton native few remember now heads Ex as president

Now serving his third year as president of the Canadian National Exhibition, W. H. Evans is recorded as a native of Acton.

It's no wonder not even the sharpest old-timers can recall the Evans family, though, and nobody seems to remember being in the same class at school.

The distinguished president of the C.N.E. was born here all right, but his parents left a few months later, before he even knew his way around. His father was a telegraph operator for the Grand Trunk Railway in Acton and a few months after the birth of son William, the family moved on to Palmerston, a bigger railway centre.

Mr. Evans Sr. subsequently transferred his allegiance to the Canadian Northern Railway, which eventually became part of the Canadian National.

The family settled in Beaverton when Mr. Evans was six years of age. Asked about his birthplace, Mr. Evans has to admit he did not have much recollection of either Acton or Palmerston, and is apt to consider Beaverton his hometown.

He has been with Honeywell Controls Co. 36 years this month, having joined it in 1931 as office manager. At that time there was a staff of an even dozen people in all of Canada.

Now the organization numbers 2,300 in this country, with a manufacturing operation in Scarborough, and Mr. Evans is chairman of the board.

His career includes public service as well as success in business. He was president of

the Canadian Manufacturers' Association in 1959 and 1960. He has been associated with the Ex for the past 10 years, the past three as president.

He's also a member of the Board of Governors of the University of Waterloo, and a member of the board of the Metropolitan Toronto Industrial Commission.

His father, Albert Evans, who was for a short time Acton's telegraph officer, is still living at age 88, although he's not too well. His mother died ten years ago last August.

## Stays in Milton

A constable with the Ontario Provincial Police in Oakville and Milton for the past 10 years, Larry Kneale has been promoted to Corporal, effective May 1. He will remain on staff at the Milton O.P.P. detachment in Milton.

Cpl. Kneale was born and educated in London. He worked as a surveyor with the Ontario Department of Highways before joining the O.P.P. in May of 1957 when he was post-

ed to Oakville detachment. In December of 1959 he was transferred to the Milton detachment.

He is one of two Milton O.P.P. officers qualified to operate the breathalyzer apparatus, following a course at the Attorney-General's Department. He and Const. Carmen Wright handle all breathalyzer tests in the North Halton area. For about one year he also served as regular court officer at the Halton Magistrate's courts in Milton.

Cpl. Kneale was one of the O.P.P. Corporals assigned to head up the search effort at Kibric when Marianne Schmitt was abducted in late April. He spent 11 days on that assignment, heading up squads of police and militia searchers, and assisting on two occasions with air searches by helicopter and light plane.

He has hunting and fishing among his hobbies. He and his wife Barbara and two sons live on the Town Line between Esquesing and Nassagaweya Townships.

Cpl. Kneale is the second O.P.P. Corporal in the Kneale family. His brother James has held the same rank with the Smithville O.P.P. detachment for the past three years.

## Find 25 cases

### TB seals raise \$37,199

Twenty-five cases of tuberculosis were detected in the 71 clinics held in Halton County in 1966. According to figures released by the Halton County Tuberculosis and Health Association, five of the 25 cases admitted were minimal, nine were moderately advanced, and five were far advanced.

Reports at the annual meeting in Oakville last week indicated during the past year, the association held a county fair to raise funds as well as selling Christmas Seals. They received \$37,199.26 from the sale of Christmas seals which

they use to fight TB and expand their fight to chronic bronchitis, emphysema and other respiratory diseases and gave grants for research.

The association helps their patients find employment and aids in obtaining financial assistance. At Christmas each patient receives a gift from the association.

Mrs. C. W. McKim represented the Halton County Association at the annual provincial meeting in May of last year and at the national meeting in Saskatoon last June.

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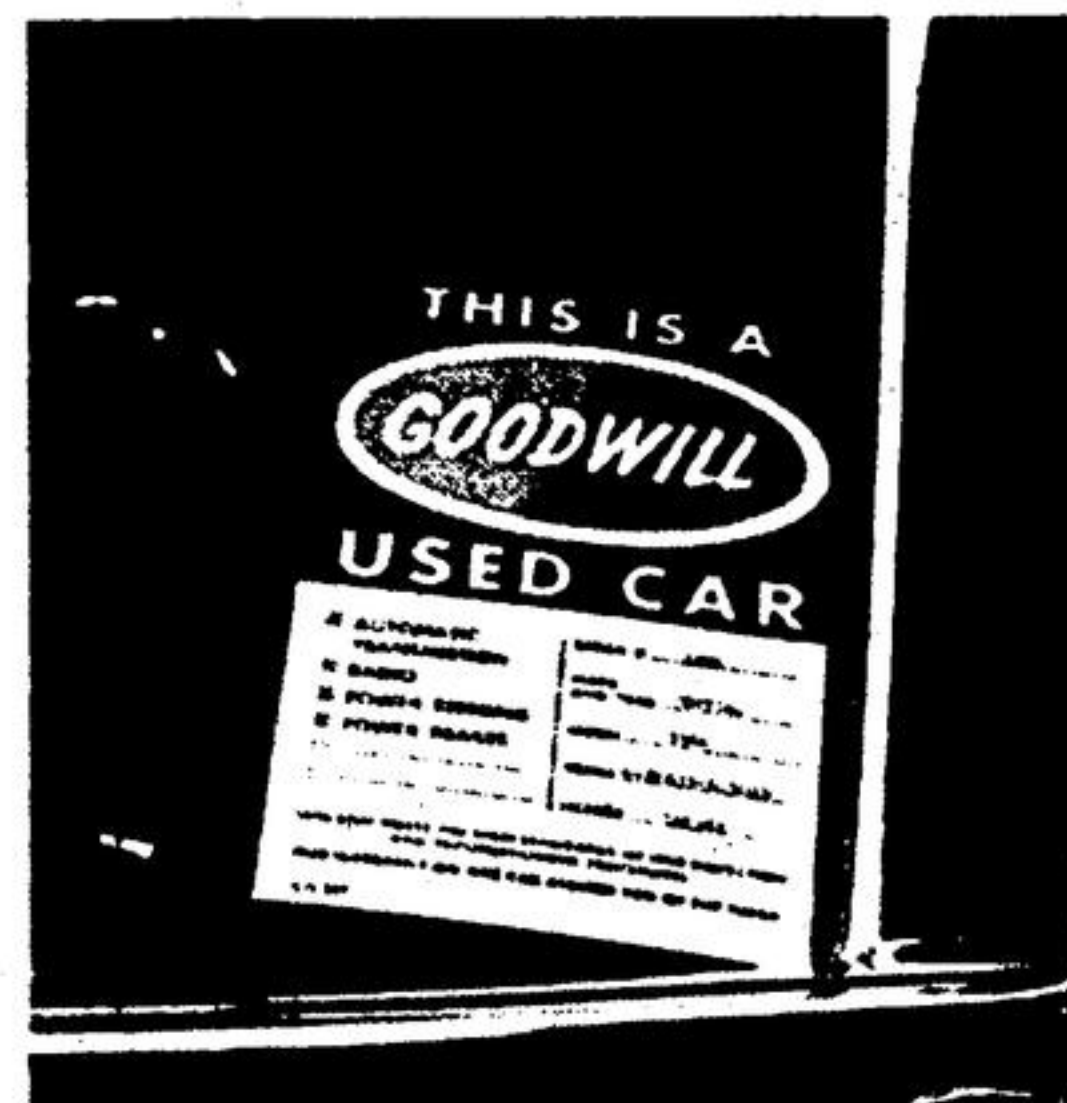
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
