Objections to the township zoning by-law from 14 property owners were reviewed by Nassagaweya Council, Wednesday. Most of the complaints centred around designations of quarry areas and their extent in the current zoning by-law, five acre lots and 2,000 square foot homes on future separations in the rural areas. The by-law was approved by Council in April.

residents would be advised if the present land uses were to be altered.

W. R. Barnes noted the area designated for quarry on his property had been worked out and operations had transferred to another section which was not included in the quarry designation.

Walter Simmons objected the quarry designation did not include his present quarry operation and the Planning Board recommended this be corrected.

The Jockey Club objected to the height restriction on construction to 35 feet and maintained this would deter expansion or improvements to the present Mohawk Raceway grandstand. They also called for the zoning to include permission for accessory uses to racetrack operation and asked they be permitted to quarry gravel on their property for their own use.

Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Still complained against the requirements for a home of 2,000 square feet and 350 foot frontage for residential construction, which was greater than that required for commercial purposes. It was pointed out smaller homes on smaller lots could be built in the village areas of the township.

Donmar Ltd. suggested none of its lands were designated for quarrying, which was the purpose they were held for, and this was like expropriation without compensation.

Other objections were lodged, protesting the requirement of five acre lots with 2,000 square foot homes on lots separated within a month after the passing of the by-law.

Council agreed, through a future amending by-law, to partly conform to the requests of Mr. Barnes on the designation of the quarrying area; to the designation of lot 28 on the west half of the fourth concession for quarrying rather than the smaller section currently designated that way; and to altering the height limitation on the Jockey Club land with reference of other Jockey Club complaints to the planners for comment.

No action was indicated on the balance of the objections filed.
