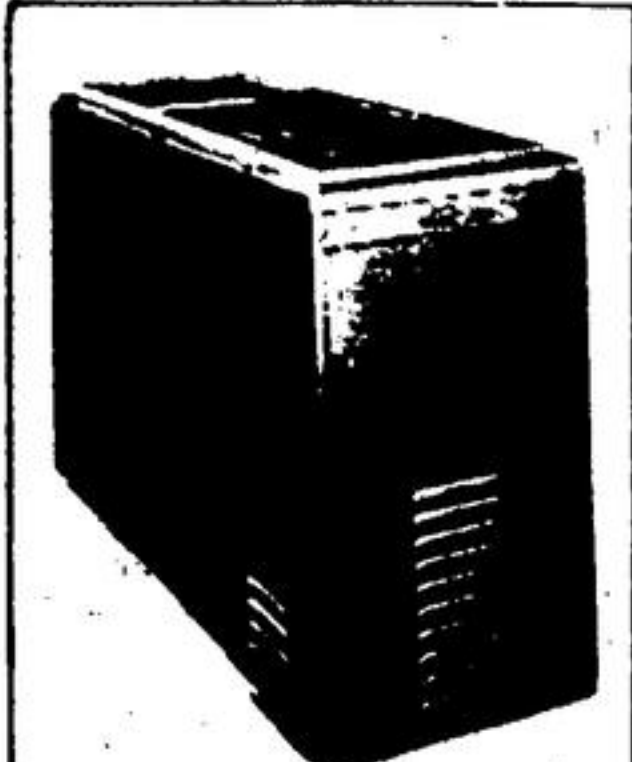

## News of the District

### GEORGETOWN

A new company in Georgetown, the H. B. Balmer Co. Ltd., is an old company to the candy business. They started making candy almost 50 years ago, back in 1919. The plant was located in Toronto until they moved to Georgetown last month.

Alexander "Peter" Politi, the present owner bought the business three years ago.

The plant has a capacity of 150,000 pounds of fudge a month — no place for the dieter. Since the fudge is two-thirds sugar, that's a lot of sugar. The other ingredients are mainly corn syrup and cream.

The main line is fudge, which is sold in chain stores, variety stores etc., all over Canada. However, they make a number of other lines and once in full swing, intend to branch into other lines.

At the moment, there are 10 employees under plant superintendent John Kelly.

The plant, built by McNally Construction, is on Armstrong Ave., Georgetown, across the road from Avian Industries.
