The migrations of many animals, including the Elk and Caribou are a result of mosquitoes and biting insects. The animals move from their winter ranges in the lowlands to higher elevations or further north to escape the insects.

In earlier times the mosquito also played an important part in keeping the human population in check. The spread of malaria and other diseases by the mosquito kept the human population to a lower level in many areas.


