Keith Mainprize brought a visitor to the range to shoot this week — his wife Helen. Helen did rather well for her first try at trap shooting. Better watch out Keith or the "better half" will be beating you at your own game.

Construction of a new trap house is getting under way this week. The new building to house the machine is to be of cement block construction and will be moved forward from the site of the present wooden structure to allow the installation of the handicap stations.

With the handicap station in place the club will be able to hold shoots registered with the American Trapshooting Association. This of course will mean anyone who plans to take part in a registered shoot must register with the A.T.A. in Van-Jania, Ohio, and he is then given a handicap. All new shooters start at the 20 yard station. After shooting a certain number of rounds the shooters record is reviewed and if he is a good shot he will be moved further back — some real good shooters in the association are back to the 27 yard line. If the

shooter doesn't do so good he will be moved forward. The shortest range possible is the 16 yard line. These distances are taken from the centre of the trap machine to the shooting station.

The mosquito has been plaguing the fishermen and varmint hunters the past few weeks and they are no doubt being described in terms of four-letter words. However the mosquito plays an important part in nature.

The migrations of many animals, including the Elk and Caribou are a result of mosquitoes and biting insects. The animals move from their winter ranges in the lowlands to higher elevations or further north to escape the insects.

While this may seem insignificant, it is very important because in this way the ranges don't get over-browsed and depleted. This is the main reason the range can support such a large population of big game animals.

The mosquito larvae also makes up an important part of the diet of most young game fish and lesser species of fish which game fish feed on.

In earlier times the mosquito also played an important part in keeping the human population in check. The spread of malaria and other diseases by the mosquito kept the human population to a lower level in many areas.
