Evergreens, shrubs are hit by insects

By Henry J. Stanley With the warm, moist weather during the past few weeks, insects are more abundant than normal on evergreens and shrubs. Aphids — the soft-bodied insects that suck sap out of the leaves on many trees, shrubs and flowers, can be controlled with Malathion. Leaf miners, which eat between the upper and lower surfaces of leaves, should be sprayed with Lindane or Cygon-2E.

As an alternative to spraying, Cygon-2E can be painted around the trunk or stem of the plant. The first generation of these insects will not be controlled, but it will help to control the next.

Mites are very prevalent in white cedar. These very small insects can be identified by a very fine webbing throughout the foliage on the cedar, as they suck the sap from the foliage and the cedar dies. Malathion can also be used for mites.

Many of these insecticides are quite poisonous, and should be handled with rubber gloves and other precautions listed on the package.

17 REAL ESTATE

Burlington could, if it wished, get along very well as a city. This was the conclusion of a recent meeting of the Citizens' Committee for an Independent Burlington.

Based on a study made in 1964, it appears that it would cost the taxpayers an extra two mills to completely separate from Halton County.

As a member of the county, the committee found that Burlington receives services through the courts, registry office health unit, children's aid, road department and Halton Manor, all of which are maintained by the county.

However, Burlington has only four county roads, Guelph Line and Cedar Springs Road north of Highway No. 5, Watford Road and No. 10 Side Road. And the committee was advised that other county services could likely be obtained on a fee basis.
