O.P.P. report

131 vehicles are checked

During the week of July 16 to 22 inclusive, personnel of the Milton Detachment O.P.P. worked a total of 863½ hours and patrolled a total of 7,610 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol 34 traffic charges were preferred, 66 traffic violation warnings were issued, and 131 vehicles were safety checked. There were 21 convictions registered.

There were four personal injury accidents resulting in four persons being injured; six property damage accidents investigated; and approximately \$9,780 in property damage recorded.

Causes of accidents were Inattentive Driving, Driver lost Control, and one vehicle caught fire and drove off roadway. There were two charges laid under the Highway Traffic Act as a result of these accidents.

There were 48 general occurrences during this period, including: three Break, Enter and Theft investigations; four Liquor investigations resulting in seven persons being charged under the Liquor Control Act; three Theft investigations; two Damage to Property investigations, two premises found insecure at night; one Juvenile missing person located by Oak Ridges O.P.P. Detachment. All other occurrences were of a minor nature, Sgt. C. J. Parkinson said.
