## Orangeville reservoir will store 624 million gallons of water

Construction of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority's Orangeville water conservation reservoir project is expected to begin August 8. Approval of the tender of Capital Paving Construction, Guelph, was obtained from the Conservation Authorities Branch, Department of Energy and Resources Management last week. This bid was low when tenders were opened July 4.

This is the climax of ten years of Authority endeavor, starting with the purchase of most of the reservoir land at the headwaters of the Credit River in 1957. The reservoir, when full, will flood about 500 acres north-east of Orangeville and provide storage for 624 million gallons of water.

The main dam, just north of Highway 9, will be 1,700 feet long and 20 feet high at the maximum point. It will contain a concrete control structure to al-

low complete control of the water level.

The north dam will be 1,800 feet in length and 17 feet high. This is to prevent overflow into the Nottawasaga River which runs through the Hockley Valley immediately north.

Spring run-off will be collected in this reservoir and used to augment the low summer flow in the Credit River. During the four months of summer, 10 cubic feet of water per second could be released to provide five times the present low flow in this area of the river.

The Ontario government will pay 75 per cent of the cost under its reservoir assistance program and the Credit Valley Conservation Authority will finance the balance out of revenues paid by its 16 member municipalities. Preliminary and design engineering was prepared by M. M.

## Five people injured in week's accidents

During the week of July 30 to August 5 inclusive, personnel of the Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, worked a total of 804 1/2 hours and patrolled a total of 7,956 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol, 39 traffic charges were preferred, 103 traffic violation warnings were issued, and 208 vehicles were safety checked. There were 10 convictions registered in Magistrate's Court.

There were 3 personal injury accidents, resulting in 5 persons being injured; 6 property damage accidents investigated, one of which was a hit and run accident, the driver was subsequently lo-

ated and charged. The total property damage involved in the 9 accidents was approximately \$5,150.

Causes of the accidents were: Inattentive Driving; Following too Close; Speed Too Fast for Road; Improper Parking; Fall to Yield Right of Way; Careless Driving; Driver Lost Control; (pedestrian) - Walking on Road. Five persons were charged with infractions of the Highway Traffic Act, as a result of these accidents.

There were 36 general occurrences during this period, including: 1 break & enter of a summer cottage, however nothing was stolen from same; theft of

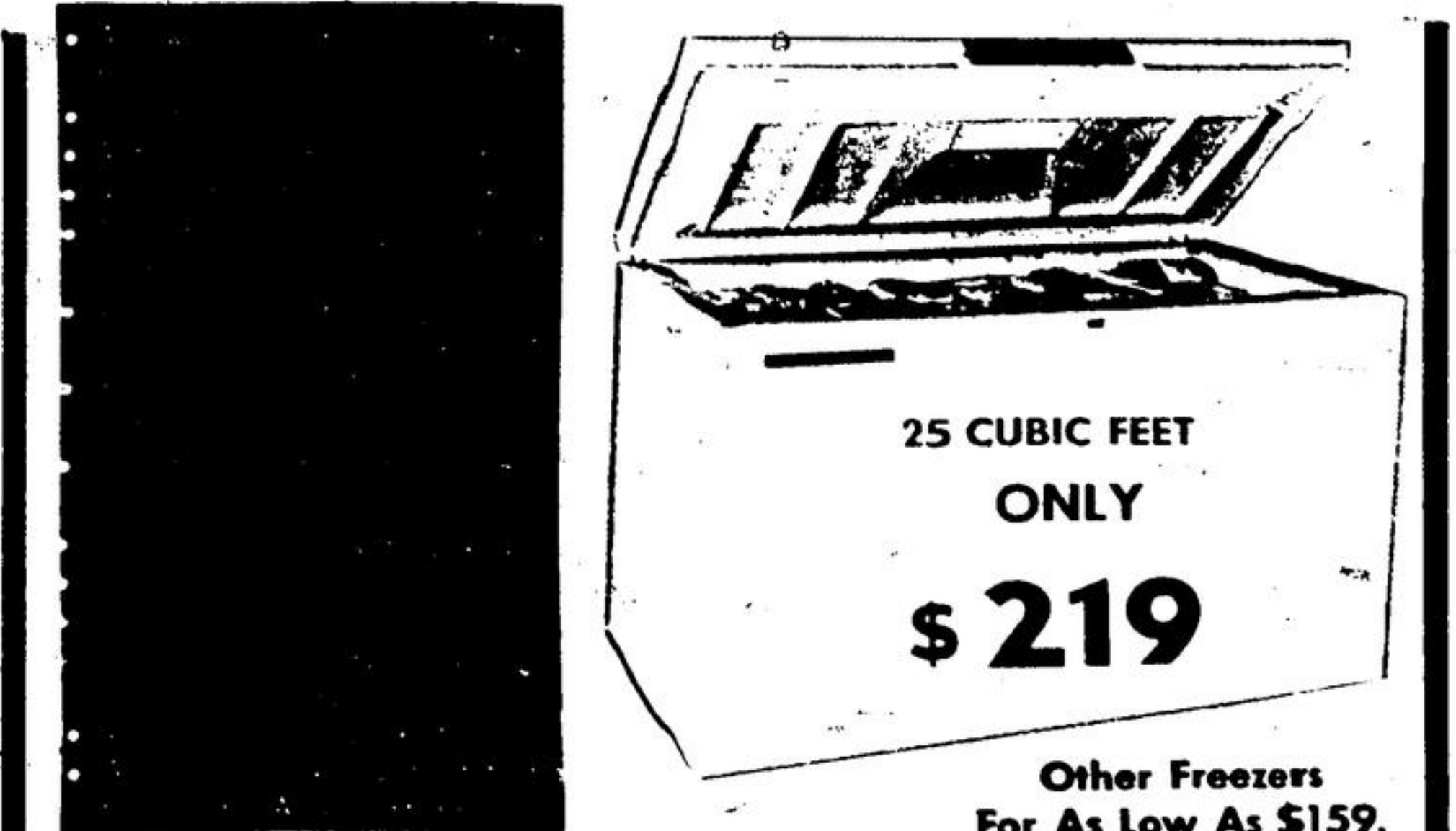
a cattle beast, later found same had strayed away; 2 acts of malicious damage investigated, one of which involved the entrance gates to Kelso Park; 2 stolen autos recovered for other police departments; 5 liquor investigations resulting in 4 persons being charged under the Liquor Control Act; 2 persons reported as missing and matters are subsequently still being investigated; 1 mentally ill person escorted to the Ontario Hospital, Hamilton. The remaining occurrences were all of a minor nature.

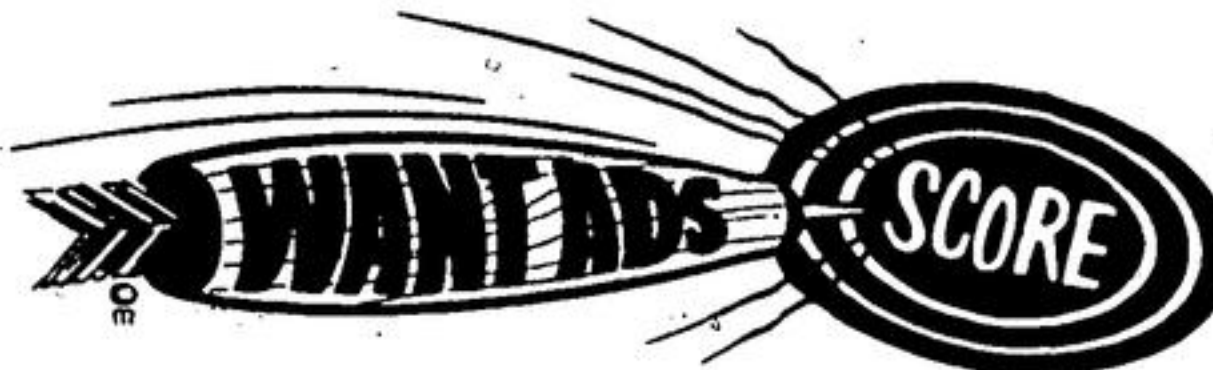

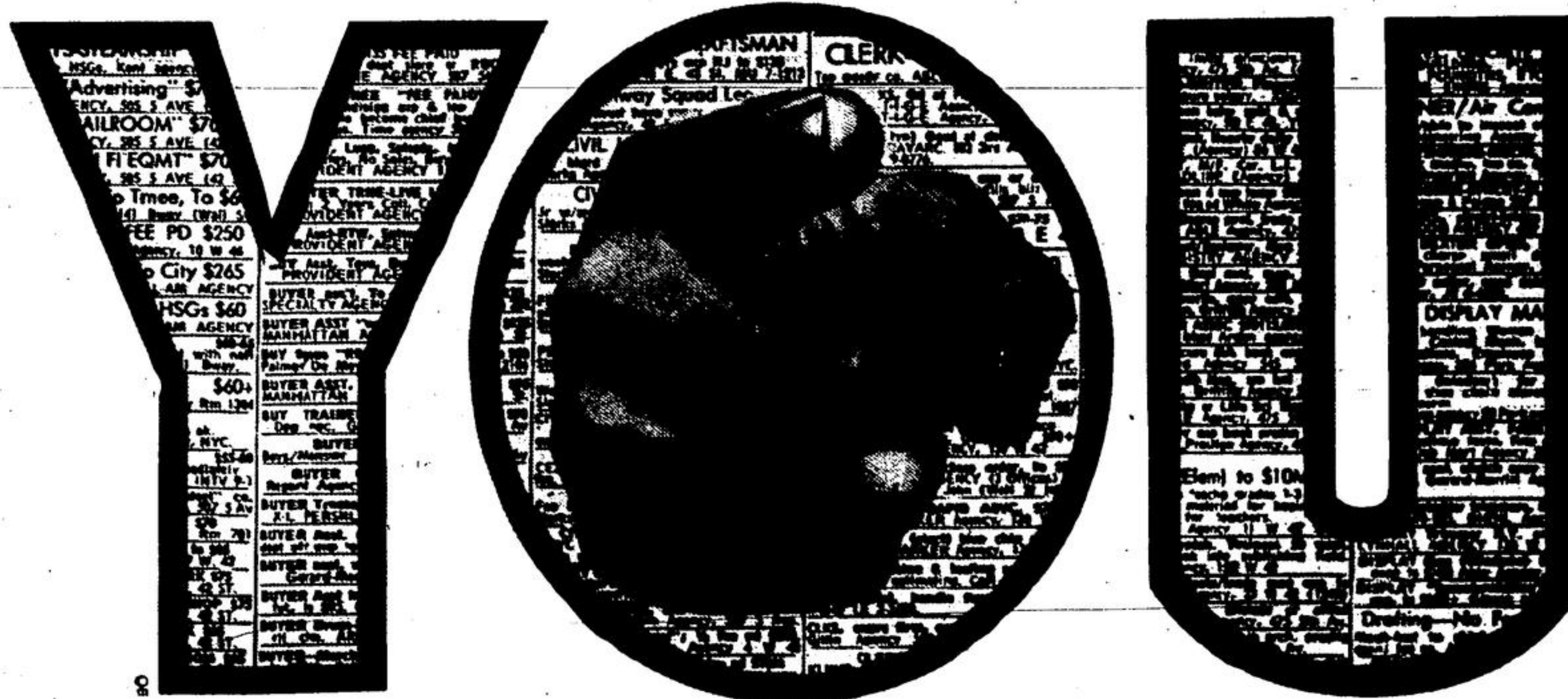
