Five people injured in week's accidents

During the week of July 30 to August 5 inclusive, personnel of the Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, worked a total of 804 1/2 hours and patrolled a total of 7,956 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol, 39 traffic charges were preferred, 103 traffic violation warnings were issued, and 208 vehicles were safety checked. There were 10 convictions registered

in Magistrates Court. There were 3 personal injury accidents, resulting in 5 persons being injured; 6 property damage accidents investigated, one of which was a hit and run accident, the driver was subsequently located and charged. The total property damage involved in the 9 accidents was approximately

Causes of the accidents were:-Inattentive Driving; Following too Close; Speed Too Fast for Road; Improper Parking; Fail to Yield Right of Way; Careless Driving; Driver Lost Control; (pedestrian) - Walking on Road. Five persons were charged with infractions of the Highway Traffic Act,

as a result of these accidents. There were 36 general occurrences during this period, including:- I break & enter of a summer cottage, however nothing was stolen from same; theft of

a cattle beast, later found same had strayed away; 2 acts of malicious damage investigated, one of which involved the entrance gates to Kelso Park; 2 stolen autos recovered for other police departments; 5 liquor investigations resulting in 4 persons being charged under the Liquor Contol Act; 2 persons reported as missing and matters are subsequently still being investigated; 1 mentally ill person escorted to the Ontario Hospital, Hamilton. The remaining occurrences were all of a minor nature.


