**Dr. T. J. Campbell interred at Acton**

The funeral of the late Dr. T. J. Campbell was held in Acton on Aug. 5 with interment in Fairview Cemetery. Dr. Campbell had been in poor health for several years but was up and around until a week before his death. He was stricken with pneumonia and passed away in Guelph General Hospital.

Dr. Campbell was born in the Moffat district and got his public school education in No. 3 School. After graduating for a veterinarian, he practiced for a short time in Ontario and then went to Avonlea, Sask., and remained there for several years. In 1931 he came back to Ontario and practiced in Erin and Bradford.

He retired to 103 Bagot St., Guelph, where he lived till his death. His wife passed away three and a half years ago. He leaves two sisters, Mrs. Florence Lasley, Guelph, and Mrs. Jean Elliott, Morriston and a number of nieces and nephews to mourn his loss. The sympathy of the community is extended to them in their time of sorrow.
