Cattle, crops earn prizes
Name Halton winners at C.N.E. *Smith went on regular old tour*

Local entries placed well at the Canadian National Exhibition cattle competitions in Toronto. In Guernsey's Mrs. H.D. MacPherson of Georgetown entered four head and won first, fourth and 12th place honors. Lloyd Pickering and Sons of Oakville entered four head and placed three 11ths, while J.D. and J.H. Cameron of Norval entered 11 head and won two thirds, two fourths, two fifths, one sixth, two sevenths, one ninth, one 11th and one 14th.

In the Holstein classes, Wm. Bennett of Burlington entered two head and placed ninth and 11th, Fred Nurse and Sons of Georgetown entered two head and placed seventh and 10th. Their entries were shown by Jeff Nurse. Howard Carzwell of Georgetown placed third once, fourth once, sixth twice, eighth once and ninth once. Pelletier Bros. of Milton placed 14th with their only entry and George and L. H. Leaver of Campbellville earned three six-

ths and one seventh place in their four entries. The Grand Champion Holstein cow, Benview Blackie Designer Ex was shown by Romandale Farms and bred by Wm. Bennett of Burlington. The third place cow, Clairdale Citation Clara Ex was shown by Oak Ridges Farm and bred by Gordon Sinclair and Sons of Burlington.

John Willmott of Milton won fourth, fifth, sixth and two ninth place prizes in the Aberdeen Angus classification.

W. F. James entered five head and won a sixth, a seventh, a ninth, a 12th, and a 13th. His Angus steers were shown by Jim McKay of Georgetown.

Graham and Evelyn Gillies of Milton entered five head in the Hereford contest and won two fourth place ratings.

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Halton Holsteins make R.O.P. record

Velbar Successor Janice, an eight-year old Holstein owned by Albert Hunter, Burlington completed her 305 day record with 24,244 lb. milk, 833 fat, for a Breed Class Average of 208 and 195. In 365 days she went on to produce a total of 26,969 lb. of milk, 933 lb. of fat. A four year old, Hilton Hartog Pabst in the same herd, produced 17,010 lb. milk, 724 lb. fat in 305 days, with BCA's of 157 and 183.

Also in the four year old class, Mell-O-Dee Shamrock Polly, owned by Howard Tarswell, Georgetown, produced 19,575 lb. milk, 706 lb. fat, with BCA's of 173 and 170.

Plumbroke Reflection Maizie, in the same age class and owned by H. C. Reid, Milton, produced 17,651 lb. milk, 677 lb. fat, with BCA's of 161 and 168. Another four year old, Portadown Achilles Zorra from the herd of Howson Ruddell, Georgetown, in 365 days produced 16,858 lb. milk, 770 lb. fat.
