While Halton is settled with its health unit nursing staff, there may be more changes in store for the county's health unit. A merger with Peel County Health Unit is being conside red.

An initial fact-finding meeting of the two county's health representatives was held in Brampton last week, and ended with a agreement to meet again in October, after the Provincial Department of Health gives some further direction on changing grants.

The Province has offered increased grants in 1968-75 per cent instead of the present 50 per cent--in return for certain programs to be instituted at the local level. Standardization of health programs and an enlargement or merger of existing services has been suggested as one an-






