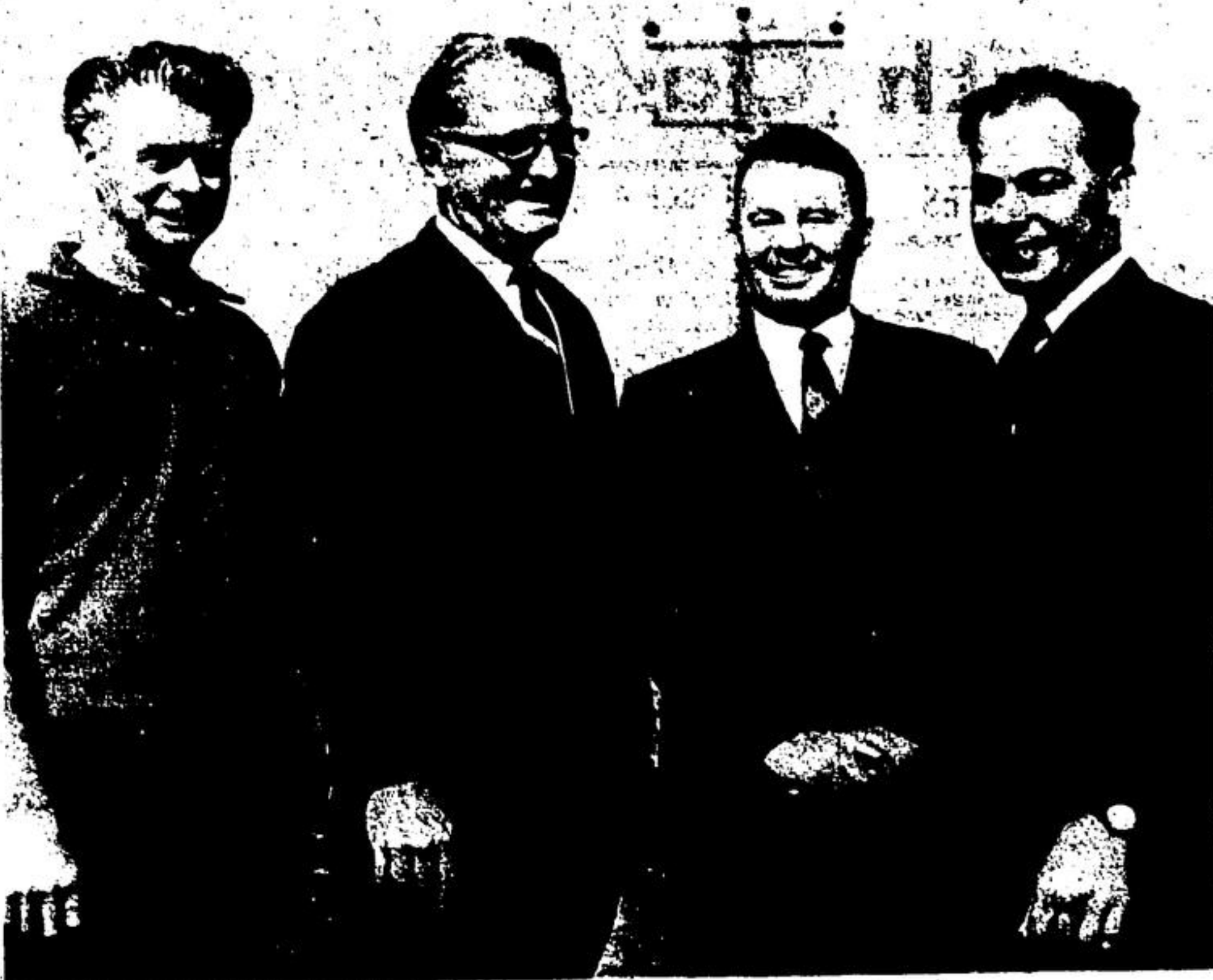

**Council hires outside solicitor represent town in drainage case**

Two Acton solicitors declared a conflict of interest so number two committee of council engaged Fred Nelson as legal aid to represent the town in the Lakeview subdivision storm water drainage problem.

Council previously complained to contractors building houses about alleged hooking into the sewage system to dispose of excess water and threatened to take legal action.

Builders said they could not get mortgage money unless springs and drains went into sanitary sewers. The ones for disposing of the excess, they claimed, lay on the town.

Mayor Les Duby said he checked with the Central Mortgage and Housing and they said no such regulation as claimed by builders existed. Any agreement was up to the parties concerned — town and contractor.

Number two committee spokesman Bob Drinkwater said his committee would continue to work on the problem. Present strategy consisted of making it mandatory for the purchaser to have a certificate of occupancy before he could move in. This would give the town control of the situation.

All 11 houses concerned in the dispute are unoccupied but some councillors were concerned about houses already occupied which may also have "illegal" connections to the sanitary sewers.

Councillor Ted Tyler said it is hoped contractors will see the problem in the same light as council and fix up connections in houses presently occupied. He hinted at possible legal action if no action is taken.

Reeve Hinton said he was in full agreement with what the committee was doing but would take them to task if they didn't

pursue their program.

Councillor Earl Masales said the committee's purpose at the moment is to check houses which are unoccupied. Occupied houses require a court order in order to make an inspection.

"We were finally able to get legal aid...let's take advantage of it," said the mayor.

Deputy-Reeve F.G. Oakes reminded council home owners could get obnoxious if an inspection is necessary. He advised caution, feeling contractors, not home owners, should be brought to task.

**O.P.P. warn litterbugs are liable for fines**

Littering is becoming a problem in the North Halton area, and is his weekly press release this week, Milton O.P.P. Sgt. C.J. Parkinson reminds motorists that Section 98 of the Highway Traffic Act provides fines for "litterbugs". Section 98 says: "Every person who throws or deposits or causes to be deposited any glass, nails, tacks or scraps of metal or any rubbish, refuse, waste or litter upon, along or adjacent to a highway, is guilty of the offence of littering the highway and is liable for the first offence to a fine of not less than \$5 and not more than \$50."

There were six charges laid as a result of these accidents.

There were 40 general occurrences reported during this period, including two assault investigations resulting in four persons being charged, one theft investigation resulting in one person being charged under the Liquor Control Act, one stolen vehicle recovered for other Police Dept., one juvenile person missing from one juvenile person missing from Esqueping Twp., being investigated, and one report of garbage being dumped in Esqueping Twp.
