New Democrats elect executive for year

A new executive was elected for the Halton West New Democratic Party at a meeting in Burlington, Thursday, November 30. Officers elected were: President, R. Rennie; 1st Vice President, D. Ewing; 2nd Vice President, B. Ahern; Organizer, P. Clancy; Secretary, J. Thatcher; Treasurer, M. Barlow; Membership, T. Macdonald; Program, B. Richardson; Public Relations, T. Kline.

In a report on the recent Provincial election, Ted Macdonald reported that the N.D.P. in Halton West had won 38

polls, tied in two polls, and ran second in 62 polls. Mr. Macdonald stressed the need for increased party membership in order to build a strong local organization.

Pat Clancy reported the cost of the recent campaign had been \$4600. Labor organizations contributed \$3100 and the balance was paid from private donations and supporters of the party. The majority of the costs were for literature and signs.

A contribution of \$750 was made to the Provincial organization.

Ask for re-appointment of planning board members

First terms of two members of planning board, Sid Saltz and Meb Blow, expire the end of this month and at the board meeting last week a resolution was passed recommending to council the re-appointment of the same two men for a three year period. (A complete new board was named a year ago, with these two men to serve a one-year term.)

Future annexation plans were discussed by the board at this meeting Wednesday, November 29. Chairman Bob Drinkwater said the proposal should be presented to council early next spring.

The board was reminded that the O.M.B. is holding a public hearing regarding the two applications of Rubin Construction which the committee of adjustment turned down October 2.

The board agreed not to object to the Sesto Construction application for a variance.

Mr. Bowman of Nelson Court attended the meeting and explained he was concerned about rumors of an apartment house being contemplated in an R 1 zone. He asked what the procedure was in having the by-law changed.

Mr. Drinkwater explained how this is done and told Mr. Bowman he didn't think such a building would be contemplated in this area.

Copies of the Georgetown and Milton zoning bylaws were presented for the board's information.

A board-staff part is being arranged for the band hall December 9.

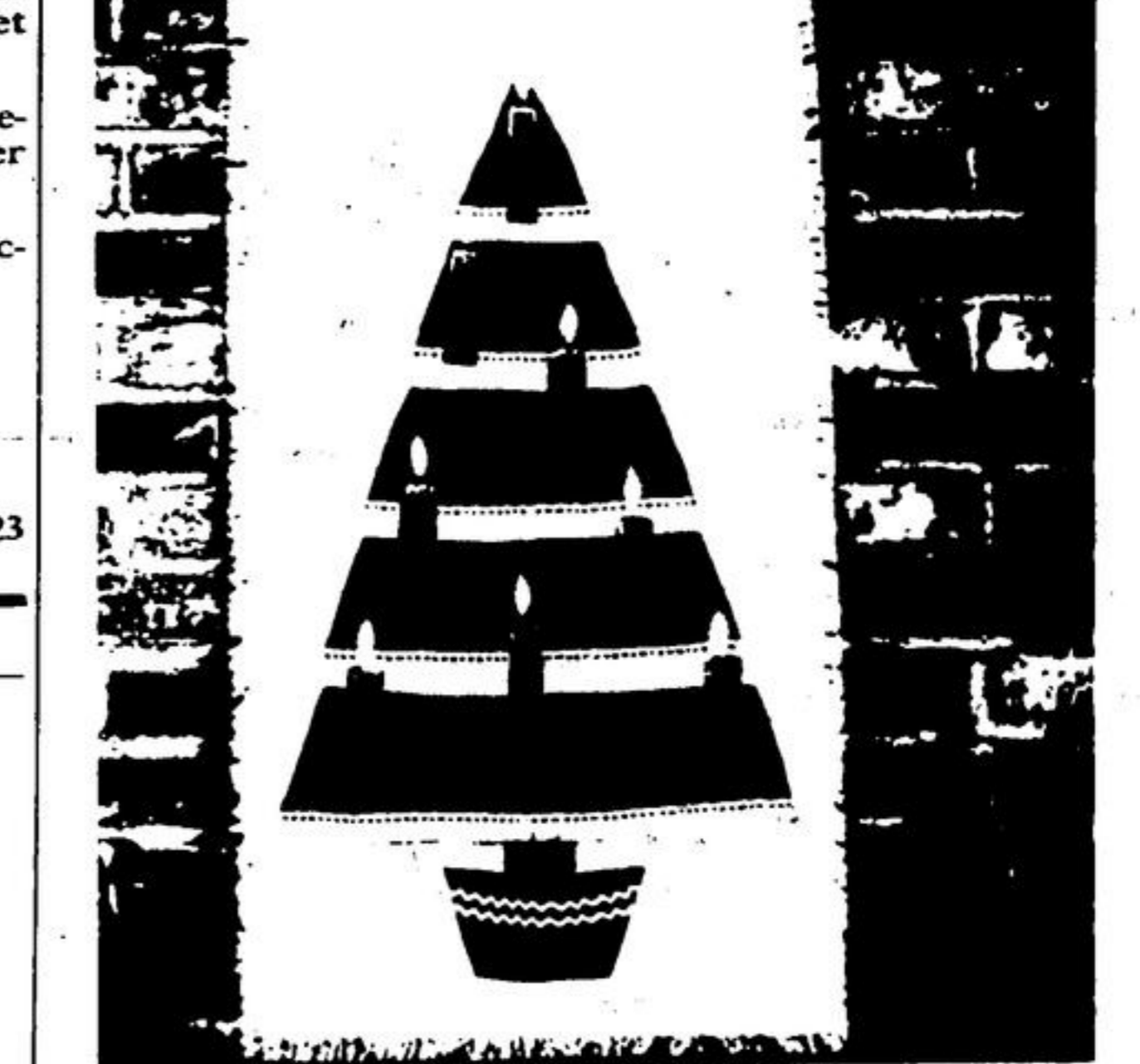
