Reeve William Coulter said he hoped to arrange a meeting soon with Esquising to try to set up a 50-50 cost-sharing agreement on the Town Line site.

Oakville site for Sheridan

Sheridan College is purchasing 102 acres of land on Trafalgar Road in Oakville, just north of the Queen Elizabeth Highway, as a site for the community college campus.

Department of Education officials announced they have agreed to owners' terms on the purchase price, for a total of \$764,400. Two parcels were purchased from holding companies of \$4,400 an acre and a 12 acre parcel was obtained from the Oakville Board of Education for \$7,000 an acre.

The college was unable to purchase the neighboring Wallace estate, which had figured in earlier plans for the campus. Construction on the new college is expected to start within a year, and a \$10,000,000 college is presently occupying temporary quarters in Brantford.
