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Turn down Orillia request increase rate on tax arrears

A resolution from the Town of Orillia requesting an amendment to the Assessment Act to permit councils to increase the interest rate on arrears of taxes was turned down by Acton council last night (Tuesday).

The Orillia resolution asked it be increased to a rate not exceeding one per cent per month. At present the rate is two-thirds of one per cent.

Reeve Bert Hinton said the resolution would only be hitting people who already have probloms a little harder.

"There's a good set-up in Acton," stated Councillor Earl Masales, "but do other municipalities need the resolution passed to help them?"

Upshot of the discussion was a suggestion from clesk-administrator Jack McGeachle that rather than increase the interest on tax arrears the town levy extra to build up a reserve fund to take care of expenses until taxes come
