Rockwood streets receive financial aid from Eramosa

Rockwood - Eramosa township councilors Monday night voted financial assistance to the village of Rockwood for road and sidewalk construction in the vicinity of Centennial School where streets are now being subjected to traffic loads beyond their capacity. Studies will be made to see if grading and gravel resurfacing will suffice or if rebuilding of road base will be necessary. Road grant was for \$2,000, half of which will be subsidized, the other half to be split equally between township and village. Parts of Mary and Pasmore streets are affected. A sidewalk on the south side of Pasmore street will be a purely village expense. Control of vehicle and foot traffic in the sector of Mary, Pasmore and Guelph streets was discussed and the possibility of having O.P.P. officials make recommendations was raised. Rockwood Brownies and Girl Guides will receive a grant of \$25 following request by their leader, Mrs. Fred Nightingale. Demonstration of a Ransohr heating machine convinced council that pricing costs could be reduced substantially by its purchase for the use of road and office departments. Purchase price is \$287, to be reduced by 10 per cent trade discount and subsidy. Council decided to renew membership in the association of Mayors and Reeves, and Municipal Clerks, and authorized payment of annual fees, \$10 each. A letter from the town of Tavistock opposing provincial legislation to consolidate school

boards in counties, and requesting council's endorsement, was ordered filed without action following suggestions that merits of merits of the plan were not made clearly evident. Tenders for the construction of the open and closed Boles drainage project were opened and held over for Triton Engineering Co. approval. A by-law governing road expense for 1968, and setting up \$18,700 for construction, \$51,000 for maintenance, will go to the Department of Highways for approval. Robert Hamilton was re-appointed road superintendent at salary of \$6,500 of which \$500 is car allowance, subject to Dept. of Highways approval. A resolution was passed by which the township staff will be reduced by one member effective May 1st. Restricted road budget allowance was given as reason for this action. Three lot severances were recommended. Next council meeting will be held on April 1 at 7:30 p.m.

Stan Randall backs J. Snow

In a speech to the Ontario Federation of Construction Associations Monday evening, Ontario's Trade and Development Minister Stanley Randall indicated his support for a resolution Halton East M.P.P. Jim Snow introduced in the legislature last week.

Mr. Snow's resolution asked the National Building Code be adopted in the province, to standardize building procedures. Mr. Randall's Monday talk supported the theory of uniform construction standards -- and he pointed out the lack of such uniform standards was increasing the costs of development and construction.

Mr. Randall felt it would be ideal if a single set of building standards was adopted for the whole nation.
