Two-thirds of the cost will be available in government grants and 1/3 must be raised locally. The expansion has been approved by the Ontario Hospital Commission.

Deputy Reave Speight said he enticipates the town treasury will have to supply at least part of the town's share.

Mayor Gibbons wondered if the hospital's location, just out of town limits in Esquesing Township, might greate a difficulty in allocating town tax money.

Organize planning for all Wellington

Wellington County council has taken the first steps towards

organized planning. A council committee will investigate the possibility of having planning consultant Howard Smith of Kitchener represent the county on area planning committees.

The committee was also instructed to look into the feasibility of undertaking some type of planning on a county basis.

Council is particularly interested in getting professional planning guidance in the Waterloo-South Wellington regional study that is now under way. At the same time, council felt it would be wise to present the

county's views on government in this area to the Waterloo area local government review being conducted by Dr. Stewart Fyfe. Councillors also supported Gualph Township's brief to the Fy! commission which opposes any drastic change in the existing forms of government in the area and advocates retention of the municipal and county administrations.

Opposition to the proposed county school boards expressed by several Western Outario municipalities was also supported by councillors since several areas of the county, particularly Guelph and Maryborough Townships feel there perhaps should be more than one board in the county.








