## Recreation committee Authorize Juvenile boxla club use of arena

Bolstered by a \$300 sponsorship grant from Beardmore and Co. plus use of the Intermediate's hockey sweaters for a start, Acton will have an entry in a juvenile lacrosse league this season.

Howard Dwyer appeared before the Recreation and Parks Committee Thursday night to explain plans for the season, the first revival of organized lacrosse here for several years. He asked for use of the community centre for practices and games.

"They've cut the funding out of lacrosse now," Howard explained, drawing a word picture of a "league" comprising perhaps 10 teams and an all Acton and district team participating. Practices have already drawn 22 players and he expects to field a contending team.

Ghewa Green Gals, Canadian champions of the O.L.A. Junior A circuit, have already agreed to play an exhibition game in Acton for support of the newly formed club, sometime in May or June. "They are willing to come because of Mrv Marshall," said Mr. Dwyer. Merv, son of Mr.

and Mrs. Albert Marshall, Roseford Terrace, Acton, played the nets for the Green Gals.

Mr. Dwyer requested at least two nights a week for games and practices.

Chairman John Goy, speaking for the board told Mr. Dwyer they'd go along with the lacrosse team to start so they can get going with our blessing. There'll be no charge for the conveniences until the club gets on its feet.

Arena manager Harold Townsley was authorized to buy wire netting to string along the boards, an action mandatory to protect fans and keep the ball in play in lacrosse.

Thursdays and Mondays were to be set aside for the juvenile club. It was felt Thursday dates would not conflict with football games the same night as the ball would be almost over when boxla games start.

In his report to the board, arena manager Townsley affirmed a swimming instructor had been hired for summer classes. He also notified the
