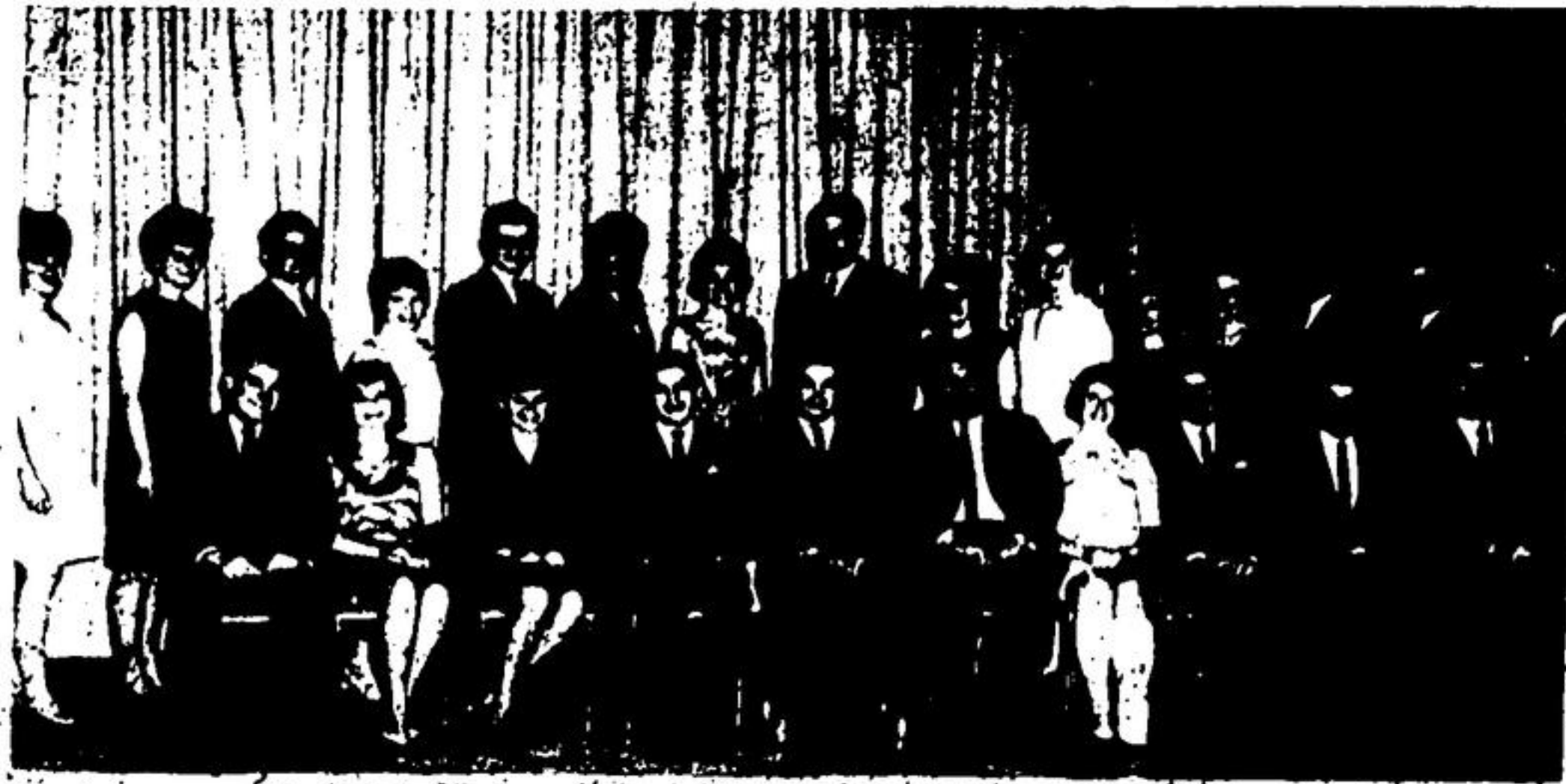
The dessert bridge and euchre held at St. Alban's Parish hall was enjoyed by everyone who attended. An attractive variety of refreshments was served. The

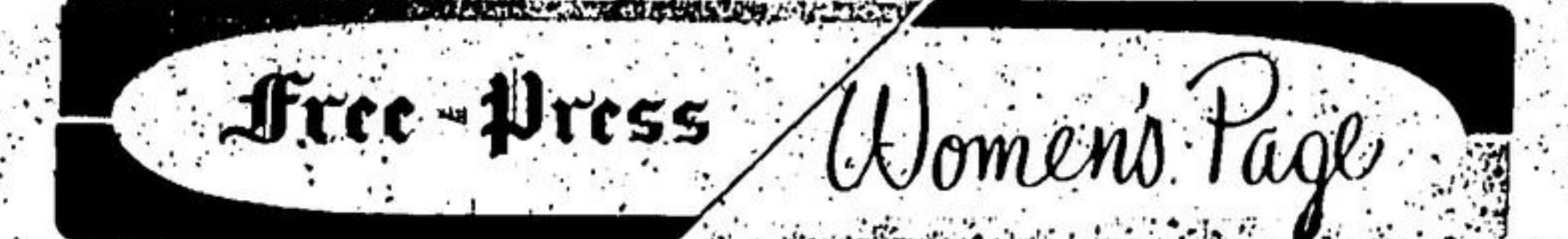
