THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ACTON By-Law No. 1419

A By-law to require the owners of privately owned outdoor swimming pools to erect and maintain fences and gates around such swimming pools and prescribing the height and description of, and the manner of erecting and maintaining such fences and gates.

WHEREAS by Section 379(1) 23 Chapter 249 R.S.O. 1960 and amendments thereto, by-laws may be passed for requiring owners of privately owned outdoor swimming pools to erect and maintain fences and gates around such swimming pools and for prescribing the height and description of, and the manner of erecting and maintaining such fences and gates.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Acton enacts as follows:

1. Every owner of a privately owned outdoor swimming pool shall erect and maintain completely around such pool a fence which shall be constructed to the following specifications: (a) Chain link fencing extending from the ground for a height of not less than four (4) feet and supported by iron posts set in concrete to a depth of at least two (2) feet and spaced not more than ten (10') apart; and

(b) Every fence shall have one gate only, which shall be of the same height as the fence, be supported by substantial hinges and be equipped with self-closing self-locking devices and a locking device all placed on the top and on the inside of the gate and shall be of chain link fencing.

2. Such fence shall be so located that entry to the swimming pool area shall be possible by means of one gate only in the enclosing fence.

3. No part of such fence shall consist of barbed wire.

4. Any device for projecting an electric current through such fence is prohibited.

5. Such gate shall be kept closed and locked at all times when the owner of the swimming pool or his duly authorized agent is not present and supervising the swimming pool.

6. The enforcement of this by-law shall be under the jurisdiction of the Building Inspector of the Town of Acton. A permit shall be obtained from the Building Inspector of the Town of Acton by the owner or his legally authorized agent for the excavation and construction of the outdoor swimming pool, fences and gate. No such work shall be commenced and no person shall proceed with any such work until a permit therefor has been first obtained from the Building Inspector. No fee shall be charged by the Town of Acton pursuant to the provisions of this by-law for such permit.

7. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay, at the discretion of the convicting magistrate, a penalty of not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars exclusive of costs for the first offence and a penalty of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars exclusive of costs for the second or any subsequent offence.

Giant supermarket for jamboree

A mile and a half of hot dogs will be consumed by the 3,000 Scouts attending the first Ontario Jamboree August 17 to 24 at the Kelso Conservation Area near Milton.

Plans to feed this mammoth Scout camp have been underway for over a year and some interesting statistics are being logged. A giant supermarket will be set up to dispense over 1,000 cases of canned goods, 20,000 quarts of milk, 8,000 loaves of bread, 40,000 eggs and all the other necessities required by hungry boys.

Best suppliers are stockpiling meat now for the big event. Nearly 10 tons of charcoal will be used to cook the meals.

To aid the sanitary conditions of the camp all meals will be taken on paper plates, cups, etc. Sixty-three thousand of these will be used in the week. Once the meals are finished the remains will be neatly put away in plastic garbage bags.

A sample menu consists of tomato juice, mixed vegetables, instant potatoes and charcoal broiled steakbits finished off with peaches and milk.

Arrangements have also been made to cater to the many visitors expected daily from 2:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. A giant canteen will be in operation to sell snacks, drinks and souvenirs.
