LEGAL

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ACTON

By-Law No. 1419 Bylaw to require the owners of privately owned outdoor swimming pools to erect and maintain fences and gates around such swimming pools and prescribing the height and description of and the manner of erecting and main taining such fences and gates.

WHEREAS by Section 379(1) 23 Chapter 249 R.S.O. 1960 and 1968, after which date the es amendments thereto, by laws may be passed for requiring owners of privately owned out door swimming pools to crect and maintain fences and gates around such swimming pools and for prescribing the height and description of and the manner of erecting and maintaining such fences and gates.

NOW THEREFORE the Municinal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Acton enacts as follows:

1. Every dwner of a privately bwned outdoor swimming pool shall great and mulntuin completely around such pool a fence which shall be constructed to the following specifications:

(a) Chain link fencing extendng from the ground for a height of not less than four (4') feet and supported by iron posts set in concrete to a depth of at least two (2') feet and spaced not more than ten (10') apart;

(b) Every fence shall have one gate only, which shall be of the same height as the fence, be supported by substantial hinges and be equipped with self-closing, self-locking devices and a tocking device all placed on the top and on the inside of the gate and shall be of chain link

2. Such fence shall be so located that entry to the swimming pool area shall be possible by means of one gate only

3. No part of such fence shall
