THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ACTON BY-LAW NUMBER 1416

A By-law to amend By-law No. 1358

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend certain sections of By-law No. 1358 relating to the regulation and use of land and the character and use of buildings and structures within the Yown of Acton;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Yown of Acton enacts as follows:

SECTION 1 - This by-law shall be known as a by-law amending By-law No. 1358 for the Corporation of the Town of

SECTION 2 - Schedule "A" to By-law No. 1358 shall be deleted and Schedule "A" to this by-law shall be inserted in its place and stead on a scale of 300 feet to one inch together with quotations and references thereon.

SECTION 3 - Section 2.38 is amended by adding thereto the following: "the maximum percentage floor area used in home occupation shall not exceed 25 percent of the floor area of the dwelling" so that section shall read "Home Occupation" shall mean any use customarily conducted entirely within a dwelling and carried on by inhabitants thereof, which use is clearly incidental and secondary to the use of the dwelling purpose and does not change the character thereof or have any exterior evidence of such secondary use. The maximum percentage floor area used in home occupation shall not exceed 25 per cent of the floor area of the dwelling. There shall be no display, no stock in trade, no commodity sold upon the premises; no person employed except such as is necessary for housekeeping purposes. It shall include the office of a dentist, physician, chiropractor or chiropodist, but a clinic, a hospital, a barber shop, a beauty parlor, a tea room and an animal hospital shall not be deemed home occupations;

SECTION 4 - Section 5.7 (a) is amended by deleting therefrom the words "into any required front or rear yard" so that the section reads "chimney breasts, main eaves, belt courses, sills or cornices not projecting more than twentyfour (24) inches".

SECTION 5 - Section 5.22 is added as follows: No person shall use, nor change the type of use of any land, building or structure in whole or in part unless a certificate of occupancy is obtained from the Zoning Administrator authorizing such use or change of use".

SECTION 6 - Section 6.1.1. is amended by adding thereto after the word chiropodist "as a home occupation" so that the section reads "A detached, one-family dwelling, the office of a doctor, dentist, chiropractor or chiropodist as a home occupation, a public park and uses accessory to the foregoing.

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SECTION 7 - Section 6.3.1. is amended by adding thereto as a permitted use after the word house "a home occupation" and after the word zone, "except a community hall and refreshment pavillion", so that the section reads "All uses permitted in the R2 Zone and the following uses: a duplex dwelling, a semi detached dwelling, a boarding or lodging house, a home occupation, a private club and uses accessory to the foregoing. All uses in Ol Zone except the community hall and refreshment pavillion, sub-

SECTION 8 - Section 6.4.1. is amended by adding thereto after the words apartment dwelling, "a homo occupation" and deleting therefrom "religious institution, a public hospital, a home for the aged," so that the section reads "All uses bermitted in the R3 Zone except detached one family dwellings, subject to the R3 Zone requirements and the following uses: a double-duplex dwelling, an. apaytment dwelling, a home occupation and uses acces-
