From the O.P.P.
Safety tips provide safe summer fun
Traffic patrols, although all phases of police work experienced statistical increases, highlight the weekly Q.P.P. report for the period July 14 to 20. During the 200 hours worked and 688 miles patrolled by the six main Acton O.P.P. force, 21 persons were charged under the Highway Traffic Act, while 12 others were warned to correct poor driving practices.
Two motor vehicle accidents, one on July 16, the other on July 20, were investigated during our reporting period. No one was injured in the collisions but, \$500.00 damage was done to the vehicles. In each instance, the erring driver was summoned to appear in Magistrate's Court at Milton.
On the General Duties side of the ledger 13 complaints, including two liquor violations, resulting in a like number of Liquor Control Act charges, and two disturbances on town streets, were dealt with. Many reports of lost and found property found their way to the Police office as well, and again we stress if you have lost an item of value, inquire at the Police office. It may be here.
To conclude our report this week, we would like to repeat a few safety tips, the do's and don'ts, that lead to safe summer recreation for you and your children.
DO continually coach your children on traffic safety.
DO set the example by practicing traffic safety yourself.
DON'T let your children swim alone or in unlighted areas.
DON'T do it yourself.
DO wear a life preserver when in a boat.
DO operate the boat in open water, away from swimmers.
If you plan to travel on your vacation there are many precaution preparations that should be made.
DO arrange for a neighbour to check your home often.
DO carry a first aid kit with you.
DO check the mechanical fitness of your car - before leaving.
DON'T rush to your destination - just get there. Finally, it is far better to be late, than not to be at all.
