Employing it effectively against the Owen Sound team right on the northerners' own ball-wick, the Acton club whipped them 9-7, despite the presence of two Junior B players in the line-up.

Annoying thing for the Sounders was the strong Tanner defence in the third period. They trailed 6-1 with only a few minutes to go in the second period. Mike Marcoux made it 6-2 in the last few seconds.

In the third period, the Owen Sound sextette couldn't hold the Tanner scoring machine. They started to click.

At the 5:18 mark Stu McCulloch scored the equalizer and the Tanners never looked back. McCulloch bagged another five

minutes later. Bob Turkosz shot his fourth and what proved to be the winning goal at 13:47 assisted by Stu McCulloch.

"What annoyed them most," said coach Dwyer, "was our defense." They had players stationed right on the goal mouth and ready to take passes. The Acton defense knocked them on the seat of their pants as soon as they took the ball.

The two Kitchener Junior B players, in the Owen Sound line-up, constitute two-thirds of the top line in their league. Acton officials were at loss to explain how the pair could legally play but were pleased at the way the Tanners handled them. They managed to get three of the Owen Sound goals.

Bobby Andrews playing his first game in goal for the Acton club played "very well" especially in the last two minutes of play when the Owen Sound club

really applied the pressure. He had no chance on the shots which eluded him.

Displeasure in the Owen Sound camp over the beating was reflected outside the arena afterwards when players and fans crowded around the Acton club and fixed them with some bone chilling epithets.

"It was all talk," said coach Dwyer. "No one pushed or shoved - just threatened."

Bob Turkosz was the big gun for the Tanners firing four goals and assisting on another. Stu McCulloch and Mike Marcoux each picked up three points, Stu

with two goals and an assist. Mike with one goal and two assists. Fred Flank and Bob Walls scored one apiece and collected an assist while Vern Denny also picked up an assist. Ron Dodswell bagged a hat trick for Owen Sound while George Irwin notched a brace. Ron Yee and Rye Ferguson scored one each.

Second win in a row for the Tanners has made a big difference in their play. They hope to make it win number three on Thursday night when they play the Virgil team.
