

A practical lesson on tuning the electrical system of a tractor was given at the third regular meeting of the Halton 4-H Tractor Club, held at Milton Equipment Co. on the Base Line.

He also demonstrated how to adjust the timing properly, and how this could develop the tractor's maximum horse-
