## Snow member of committee reviewing taxation briefs

The Select Committee studying the 347 recommendations of the Smith Report on Taxation is scheduled for presentation by September 17, M.P.P. Jim Snow, a member of the committee, reported this week.

The Committee under chairman John White, M.P.P. London South, has recently been holding hearings throughout Ontario to receive briefs. The hearings have now concluded during which 111 submissions were reviewed. Mr. Snow pointed out, and the committee this week is considering the written submissions which were also

presented without personal appearances.

No submissions were made by any of the county municipalities but the County Federation of Agriculture, in co-operation with other Federations, was represented in the briefs.

The committee began its hearings before the Legislature prologued and held hearings in the Metro Toronto area two or three days a week during June.

Following this the committee spent a week in Northern Ontario

at Port Arthur, Timmins and Sudbury. The second week was in Ottawa, Kingston and Peterboro and the third week in Windsor, London, St. Catharines and Hamilton.

The Federation of Agriculture brief expressed concern with proposed changes in municipal taxation.

The Select Committee is made up of eight Progressive Conservative members, three Liberals and two New Democrats. Mr. Snow indicated the committee faced a monumental task in reviewing the submissions weighing a total of 100 pounds.
