O.P.P. report

During the week of August 18 to 24, officers of Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, investigated 48 occurrences including two assaults, two minor thefts, three malicious damage investigations, three cars recovered for other forces, one car reported stolen recovered in Esqueping Twp., one liquor investigation resulting in one person being charged, two complaints of persons being bitten by dogs, two investigations of persons alleged to be hunting but both were unfounded, and two premises found insecure at night.

A total of 19 accidents were investigated including one fatal accident in which one person was killed, five personal injury accidents resulting in 11 persons being injured, and 13 property damage accidents. Total property damage for the week was \$12,960.

Seven charges were laid as a result of these accidents. Causes of accidents were careless driving, speed too fast, inattentive driving, defective brakes, car caught fire and wrong side of road.

The Department of Correctional Services has announced the appointment of William L. Barber, 49, as Governor of the Halton County Jail, Milton.

He assumes the position left vacant when the former Governor, Glen Ryder, retired at his own request.

Mr. Barber served in the R.C.A.F. during World War II. His previous experience with the Department includes service at the Ontario Training Centre, Brampton, and Wellington County Jail, Guelph. While with the Department, he completed a Correctional Officer's Training Course and, later, as a member of the Brampton Police Department, attended an advanced training course for detectives at McMaster University. He served in the Brampton Police Department for 15 years and rose to the rank of Staff Sergeant.

Mr. Barber is married and has three children. He makes his home in Brampton and will commute from there.
