Rev. Horsburgh and Rev. Price are directors of Youth Anonymous in Toronto. It is an international organization for the rehabilitation of youthful offenders and has been described "the most amazing rehabilitation program of the century". Patterned after Alcoholics Anonymous, it has. seven steps that lead to self-awareness and freedom.

As "Street Padre" Rev. Ron Price visits the haunts of youth counsels those in trouble and steers them Into the Youth Anonymous therapy groups. He also directs the sessions of Youth Anonymous which meet each week at a counselling clinic.

Rev. Horsburgh, executive director of Youth Anonymous, organizes youth co-ordinating committees from church youth groups. He also directs a follow-up program to get youth into job opportunities and back to school. As well, he teaches the seven-step program to Parents' Anonymous.

"Young people today lack direction" asserts Rev. Ron Price. "They are wandering aimlessly and I find that my responsibility is to lead them to those places where they can find meaning for life. The Church is not reaching the young people we seek to help. It needs to drag itself away from the fusty past and work side-by-side with today's troubled, vibrant times. In this new ministry, we are taking the church out of its isolation within four walls and into the market-place where it
