"It will be a singing, shouting, clapping time—a total involvement," claims Rev. Russell D. Horsburgh.

The Canadian Mustard Seed Tour will visit Acton United Church on Sunday night, September 15, at 8 o'clock. Rev. Russell Horsburgh and Rev. Ronald Price, Toronto's "street preachers" will present what has been described as "the most talked-about program of the year."

Twenty-five year old Ronald Price, known as "The Singing Parson" will present a "Sing-in" accompanied by the organ by his wife Sharon. His rendering of folk-songs, Gospel rhythm and spirituals have won him awards on national television programs in Canada and the United States.

Rev. Russell Horsburgh, acquitted earlier this year, on charges of contributing to juvenile delinquency when youths in Chatham signed affidavits admitting that they lied in court, will present a "teach-in" on the problems of delinquency and rehabilitation. His topic will be "What Makes A Juvenile Delinquent?"

He will tell about his experiences with young people in Toronto's Yorkville area and in the jails he visits to counsel convicted juveniles.

Two charter trips to the Stratford Festival on Sept. 13 and Sept. 30 are planned.

Present at the regular meeting were chairman Duncan Moffat, vice chairman Tom Watson, members Chester Anderson, Kerwin McPhail and Ray Arbic; secretary-treasurer Fred Salt, principal Hansen and vice principal Bray.

After adjournment, the meeting went into committee of the whole to discuss other matters after the press left.

O.P.P. report

93 vehicles checked just six get sticker

The past week in town saw the arrival and departure of the Department of Transport Safety Lanes, which were again located on Fellow St. This year there was a marked decrease in the number of vehicles checked due to weather conditions which eliminated work one day altogether.

In two full days of checking, a total of 93 vehicles received the 10 minute test and of these only six received safety stickers.

The majority of faults were found to be in the front end alignment and head lights not being correctly focused. The license plates were removed from a small majority of the vehicles checked.

The startling difference between the number of cars issued with stickers and the number of cars checked would lead one to believe that cars are not kept in as good condition as the owners believe. If you did not have your car checked at the safety lanes it might be a good idea to take it to the garage of your choice and have it checked. Remember it is the lives of you and your family that depend on your automobile.

The personnel of Acton Detachment had a moderate week with a slight slowdown from previous weeks. One dozen occurrences were investigated.

Complaints included one recovered car with two arrests, two thefts of a minor nature, one L.C.A. violation, one offensive weapon and one malicious damage as well as other occurrences of a minor nature.
