farmers' dogs destroyed

A highly incensed Eramosa Township council instructed clerk Lloyd Hindley to notify a local farmer that his dog or dogs had caused \$700 to \$800 damage to livestock, and must be destroyed within 48 hours. Proof of ownership had been clearly established. Pitiable scenes following dog attack had been withested by council

members. Council instructed its building inspector to notity a trailer-occupant that the period of time covered by his several extensions had expired and that he must move his trailer out of the township within 14 days,

The clerk was instructed toask the township lawyer to re-examine trailer regulations for . possible loopholes.

Request of a Rockwood business man for permission to extend a street adjoining his property, or remove anoffending tree, at his own expense, was sent back to Rockwood board of trustees for re-consideration and recommendation.

Request of several Rockwood residents for action to control water - movement over their properties was likewise referred back to the village for recommendation or otherwise. It

was felt that this was a purely village matter.

Grants of up to \$50 for agricultural societies in Fergus, Erin, and Acton were authorized. Membership in the County Clerk and Treasurers' Association was renewed and payment of \$10 fee was authorized.

Council requested the clerk to send for information regarding Eramoia's withdrawal from the Central Wellington High School board so that it would be available for the hearing. A letter of thunks was ordered

sent to the department of highways for installation of hand-railing on the west side of the hill between upper and lower business sections in Rockwood. Road superintendent Robert Hamilton was instructed to advertise for quotations on anew all-purpose truck, equipped , for plowing, sanding, etc.

Six hundred dog tage were ordered for 1969 use. Previous orders of 500 were proving nadequate.

Accounts totalling \$17,878.79 were passed for payment.


