Malicious damage, trespassing among past week's complaints

During the week of September 8 to 14, officers of the Milton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, investigated 36 general occurrences including three malicious damage complaints, three thefts, two break-ins, one fraud, five liquor investigations, two assaults, and one trespassing complaint. Four cars were reported abandoned, and three complaints of horses loose on the highways were reported. One stolen car was recovered and two premises found insecure at night.

A total of 11 accidents were investigated including five personal injury accidents in which nine persons were injured, and six property damage accidents. Total property damage was \$19,090. There were four charges laid as a result of these accidents. Causes of accidents were careless driving, improper turn, speed too fast for road or traffic conditions, and

The Editor, The Free Press, Acton, Ontario.

Dear Sir:
 Recent happenings in Czechoslovakia bring to mind the sequence of events in the communization of that country twenty years ago. The sequence included:

1. REGISTRATION of firearms.
2. CONFISCATION of firearms a few months later.
3. COMMUNIZATION by legislation shortly thereafter.

This familiar pattern of events has occurred in many areas now under communist or neo-communist control. It is more than obvious that the Czechoslovakys do not like their enforced communization with its attendant loss of liberty. Without firearms the people are defenceless against the invader, the outlaw or the anarchist.

Bill C-195, an Act to amend the Criminal Code, given first

reading in the House of Commons of Canada, Dec. 21, 1967, provides for the compulsory registration of all firearms in Canada, including rifles and shotguns. This same Bill also contains controversial liberalizing sections on abortion and homosexuality.

Bill C-195 will, undoubtedly, be presented early in the next Parliament for final approval. Congressed Canadians and all owners of rifles and shotguns should immediately write, telephone or telegraph their Federal Member of Parliament, forcibly stating their disapproval of this gun legislation and demand that their M.P. oppose it in every way possible.
