# Let's Play Bridge

It's sometimes easy to see how to play a hand when you are looking at all four hands such as in this column. If you were at the table you could only see two hands. Cover the West and South hands and see what you would play as East when your partner leads the three of spades against at three no trump contact.

This hand was played at the Acton Bridge Club. East-West were vulnerable and South dealt. NORTH

That is, open two no trump on 21-22 points or on 22-23 points not on 21-23" points. But make sure your partner knows which range you are using.
