

Savings Bonds sales reach \$521,000 here

A total of \$18,163,000 in sales of the 1968 series of Canada Savings Bonds through payroll savings has been achieved to date by Ontario organizers in the current campaign.

In a report on the campaign's progress, C. G. Beatty, Ontario regional director, notes that 41,789 applications have already been processed by campaign headquarters in Toronto.

He describes the campaign results to date as "encouraging" and points out that 94 establishments have already exceeded their last year's total sales by more than \$700,000. Of these, 16 are offering Canada Savings Bonds through the payroll deduction plan for the first time.

Sales to date in the Halton-Peel counties area total \$521,000. Organizers for the area are W. G. Shippen and John E. Sharpe.

Supervisor for the payroll savings campaign in the "Golden Horseshoe" region is Ormsby Doherty of Toronto.

O.P.P. report

New regulations for snowmobiles

During the past weeks the Acton Detachment has experienced a slow down in general occurrences and traffic accidents. With this slow down there has naturally been more time on everybody's hands and thus the radar has been seeing extensive use.

This reporting week saw 20 charges laid under the Highway Traffic Act and of those, 12 were radar charges. Nine people were warned regarding their driving habits.

There were no traffic accidents reported or investigated by this detachment.

Prov. Const. R. Wood gave lectures at the Acton High School to 32 students in respect to their obligations when involved in a motor vehicle accident.

General occurrences reported through the week were mostly of a minor nature. A stolen licence plate off a motorcycle and liquor seizure were the major occurrences.

Since Thanksgiving holiday fell on Monday, no court was held at Milton.

Just recently new legislation regarding snowmobiles was passed, the local O.P.P. detachment points out. Now before a snowmobile can be driven by anyone, anywhere, it has to be registered with the Department of Transport and have a licence plate exposed on the front end in clear view. No person under the age of 16 years can operate a snowmobile upon a highway, and only on certain roadways are snowmobiles allowed.

If a snowmobile is being legally driven on a roadway, it has to be insured just like a car and if the driver is asked by a police officer, insurance must be produced.

Convictions registered under this act call for a fine of not less than \$20 and not more than \$100, except for the insurance clause which is not less than \$50 and not more than \$500.

When a snowmobile is driven on a highway it will be governed by the Highway Traffic Act the same as a car and thus speed limits, stop signs and generally the rules of the road will apply.

Common sense on the operator's behalf should eliminate the chance of being charged, or worse still killed or injured in an accident.

If the rules are obeyed, snowmobiles can be an unlimited source of fun for the whole family, so let's obey them and make your winter months as well as mine, more enjoyable.
