Just recently new legislation regarding snow-mobiles was passed, the local O.P.P. detachment points out., Now before a snowmobile can be driven by anyone, anyplace, it has to be registered with the Department of Transport and have a licence plate exposed on the front end in clear view. No person under the age of 16 years can operate a snowmobile upon a highway, and only on certain roadways are snowmobiles

If an snowmobile is being legally driven on a roadway, it has to be insured just like a car and if the driver is asked by a police officer, insurance must be

produced. Convictions registered under this act call for a fine of not less than \$20 and not more than \$100, except for the insurance clause which is not less than \$50

and not more than \$500.

When a snowmobile is driven on a highway it will be governed by the Highway Traffic Act the same as a car and thus speed limits, stop signs and generally the rules of the road will apply. Common sense on the operator's behalf should eliminate the chance of being charged, or worse still killed or injured in an accident.

IF the rules are obeyed, snowmobiles can be an unlimited source of fun for the whole family, so let's obey them and make your winter months as well as mine, more enjoyable.


