## Air strip at Ross Lake farm small craft tie-in by winter

Small planes will soon be able to fly in and tie up on the farm of Joe Ross, R.R. 3, Georgetown.

The runway, which will measure 150 feet wide and 2,000 feet long has already been cleared and leveled ready for sodding. Within the next month Mr. Ross hopes to begin construction of a small hangar for repairs and refueling.

"There's a greater need for an airstrip around here than you would imagine," claims Mr. Ross. He cites as an example Jim Snow, M.P. for Halton West, who owns a plane and is interested in using the facilities.

When finished, the runway area will be flat and grassy like a golf course. The site is high, well drained and relatively level to begin with. "You should be able

to drive a car down it at 80 miles and hour, to be right," says Mr. Ross.

Mr. Ross had thought of opening a flying school but because of opposition from neighbors he has resigned himself to a small air strip, open to the public, for repairs, refueling, fly-ins and tie-ups. An aeronautical engineer will be on hand. The strip will not be licenced.

Mr. Ross feels that he will have at least 12 planes tie up on the strip for the winter.

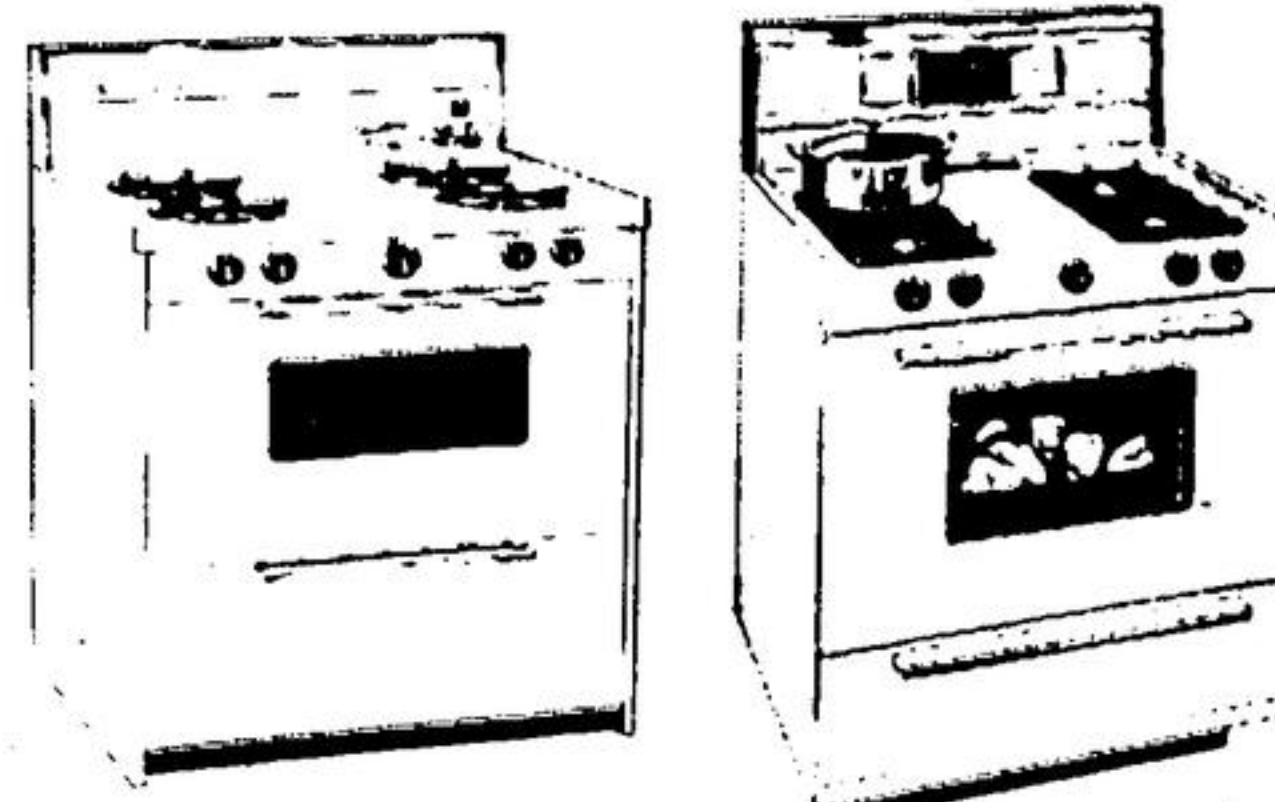
