Tour of watershed includes Fairy Lake

Blinding rain, wind and gray skies of early morning turned to sunshine and warmth for the recent Credit Valley Watershed tour taken by the Streetsville Council and interested staff and ratepayers of the town. Almost 50 people participated.

First stop was the headquarters of the Authority at Meadowvale. Visitors were impressed with the beauty and efficiency of the office, built inside the old "Mill House", circa 1830.

The tour wound its way north along the valley to the Terra Cotta Conservation Area where the Authority provides a showcase of all conservation projects. After coffee and doughnuts, the tour went on to Belfountain Conservation Area and through the Forks of Credit. This part of the Valley is one of the most beautiful in Ontario and everyone agreed that the autumn season was the time to see it at its best.

A trip to Orangeville to look at the new Orangeville Reservoir, almost ready for flooding, was next. This reservoir will hold 164 million gallons of water when full and will provide flood control for the upper reaches of the river. Monora Conservation Area at Orangeville was included on the itinerary.

The bus then proceeded south and west from Orangeville past the wild area owned by the Authority in the vicinity of Caledon Lake. This 500 acre area will be preserved as it is, forest, swamp and grass land.

Hillsburgh Conservation Farm was next stop, then on to Acton for a look at the pilot dredging project of the Authority at Fairy Lake. This project is well on its way to completion and if it proves economically feasible, more small lakes and ponds in the Credit Valley and other valleys in Ontario will benefit.

The tour wound its way home down Highway 25 through the Halton Region Conservation Authority areas along the escarpment.
