The policy resulted in a study, now under way, to determine the anticipated demand for public park areas as a result of a rapidly-expanding population in the valley.

The authority has also refused to allow a cottager to take up year-round residence at Lake Belwood. Cottage lot leases prohibit year-round occupancy because of the problems that could result for the local municipality if it occurred on a

The executive has also been told that more than 200 cottage owners at both lakes liave. improved sanitary facilities as a result of inspections carried out hy the Wellington County Health Unit. Dr. B. T. Dale, county medical officer, sent a team of inspectors around the cottage areas.
