**Georgetown mayor dies**

The mayor of Georgetown for 18 years, J. Joseph Gibbons passed away suddenly in Georgetown District Memorial hospital on Wednesday, November 20. He had just announced his retirement from politics a few days before. He was a barber from 1914 until 1949, and had been assessor for 12 years. Mr. Gibbons was well-liked by young and old, and was always willing to help anyone in need. The concerns of others always interested him. As well as municipal work, he was active in lawn bowling. As mayor, he was associated with many local groups. Mr. Gibbons was born in Acton in 1890, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Gibbons, Mr. and Mrs. Gibbons were married in Acton, February 7, 1921. As well as his wife at 30 Martin St. N., Georgetown, Mayor Gibbons is survived by a sister, Miss Anne Gibbons, St. Joseph's Nursing Home, Guelph. Other relatives live in Acton. The funeral was at Holy Cross church, Georgetown, on November 23, conducted by Rev. V. J. Morgan of Acton and Father Devent of Georgetown. Interment was in Greenwood cemetery.
