# Tanners lose three Hespeler here Friday

Crippled by injuries and with the bare minimum of players necessary to ice a team the Tanners lost three straight games over the past week.

Seaforth dumped them 11-5 in a fast skating encounter at Seaforth Thursday and the Tanners had a date at home the very next night against Georgetown. The Raiders ganged up on them 17 players to 10 and won a 7-2 verdict which the Acton club gave up reluctantly in the last period.

Monday night, a return bout with the Raiders in Georgetown was another one-sided 13-4 Georgetown victory.

Jim Sweeney was the scintillating star of all three games, turning aside everything but the kitchen sink. The Acton club lacked the legs in the final

minutes of all three games and it allowed the opposition to pile up goals.

Seaforth went into a 3-0 lead in the first period of Thursday's game on two pucks which bounced weirdly past Sweeney and a clear-cut backhand by Bob Buettenmiller. Midway through the second stanza, the Beavers had a 6-0 lead when the Tanners started to come alive.

Jim Farrelly bagged the first goal, picking up Harold Townsley's rebound. Steve Gervais backhanded in Jan Riddell's pass to make it 6-2. Seaforth came back with two more goals before Harold Townsley's sizzling slapshot from the blue line scored.

The Acton club were comers in the third stanza and Gordie Bell made it 8-4 when he

slipped in on the right side and lifted a shot into the top corner. Two minutes later Farrelly bagged his second goal of the night from 'Red' Phillips and it looked like the Tanners might come back to tie it. Then with Steve Gervais serving a cheap two minute minor, Gordie Bell accidentally tipped a Seaforth shot into the Acton net and it put a different complexion on the game. The Beavers added two more to win going away.

Back-to-back games, never popular in amateur hockey, was a factor Friday as the Tanners lost a 7-2 decision to Georgetown. It was a close game for two periods when the Tanners ran out of legs and Raiders capitalized on the weakness.

Georgetown led 3-1 at the

end of the first period and bagged another in the second, adding three more in the final chapter to one from Acton. "Smokey" Richardson and Jack Gudgeon scored two apiece for the Raiders, Jim Blair, Paul Robinson and Don Norton each notched one. 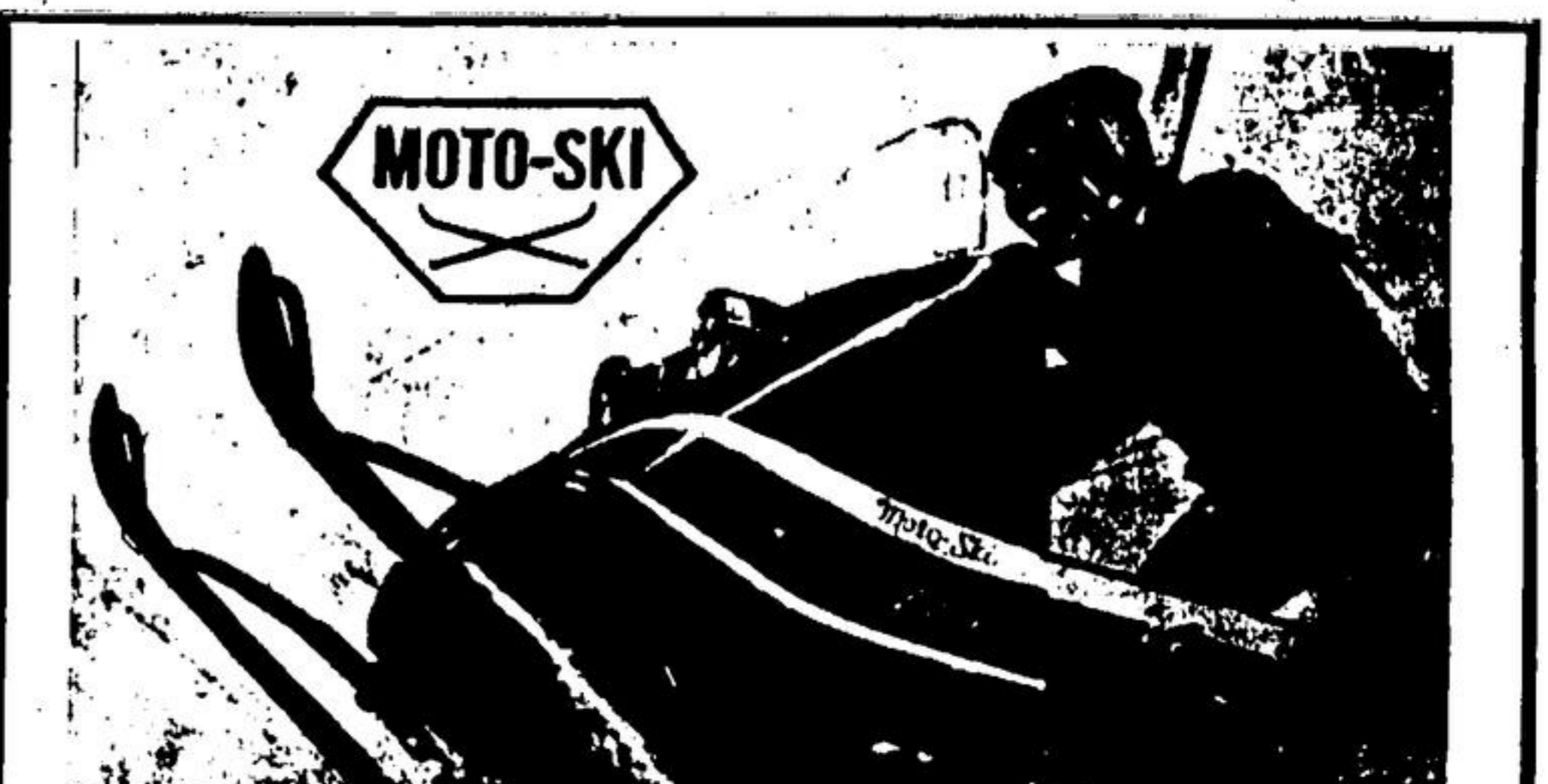
