The Indians called cranberries the 'bitter berry.' Early American Pilgrims, noting the fruit to be the favorite of cranes, began referring to them as cranberries, and eventually cranberries.

Anything can make a tree but evergreen most popular

Almost anything can be and is a Christmas tree. In Minneapolis, Minn., they even made a tree out of water pipes, fastened like spokes to a telephone pole, and appropriately decorated.

In Wilmington, N. C., a live oak more than 300 years old is adorned as the Yuletide with colorful ornaments and electric lights. In Indianapolis, Ind., they decorate the 246 foot Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument with electric candles and stars.

The U. S. National Christmas Tree, officially designated in 1926, is not an evergreen but a giant redwood, located in Kings Canyon National Park, California.

This unusual Christmas tree, called the "General Grant", is 3,800 years old.

Many families prefer the "permanent" Christmas tree, often made of aluminum.

Despite all this, the time-tested favorite tree is still the evergreen. Most people, if asked, would probably vote for the "fir tree".

Actually, there are nearly 40 species of the popular "fir tree" found in the mountainous regions of Central and Southern Europe, Asia north of the Himalayas and North America.

A frequently seen Christmas tree variety is the "balsam fir", also called "Canada balsam" or "Balm of Gilead". This is one of the most common trees of eastern North America, extending from Virginia and West Virginia in the United States to Labrador and Newfoundland.

In Canada, the exporting of Christmas trees including firs, pine and spruce, is important business. Seven provinces export trees to countries as far away as Venezuela.

In Christmas trees, it's the spirit that counts.

CHRISTMAS TREES
It's getting close to Christmas once again, and millions of colorful Christmas trees will be set up across the country. But don't let them become a fire hazard. Choose a fresh tree, cut off the bottom of the trunk, and set the tree up so that the butt is in water. Keep adding water daily to replace that used. Don't let your tree be a fire hazard.

Christmas ornaments, particularly the strings of small lights for the Yule tree, are potential hazards. Children sometimes will pick up a small bulb and pop it into the mouth with obvious results.


Candles linked to superstition

Candle toke are purely decorative, step by birthdate, and in the churches. Man's source of light is electricity.

While traditionally associated with religious worship, candles are also the source of some superstitions. A blue flame, for instance, was once believed to signify there was a ghost in the house. A spark from a candle was supposed to indicate that the person nearest the candle would soon receive an important letter.
